4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

DANGER. May be harmful if swallowed. Causes skin irritation and eye damage.

5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Specific hazards arising from the chemical: Containers may build pressure and rupture.

Specific fire-fighting methods: Promptly isolate the scene by removing all persons from the vicinity of the incident if there is a fire. Use water spray to keep fire-exposed containers cool.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal precautions: Put on appropriate personal protective equipment (see section 8).

Environmental precautions and clean-up methods: Stop all leaks. Isolate hazard area. Keep unnecessary and unprotected personnel from entering. Prevent runoff from entering drains, sewers, streams or other bodies of water. Absorb spill with inert material. Absorb unrecoverable product. Transfer contaminated absorbent, soil and other materials to containers for disposal.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Do not use or store near heat, sparks or open flame. Store in a cool, dry place. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. Keep out of reach of children.

8. EXPOSURE CONTROLS/PERSONAL PROTECTION

Eye Protection: Wear safety glasses or goggles.

Skin Protection: To prevent repeated or prolonged contact, wear impervious gloves (made from rubber, nitrile or neoprene).
