

The regular monthly meeting of the Nazareth Borough Municipal Authority was held on April 16, 2026, at 7:00 p.m., at the Nazareth Regional Ambulance Corps building. Board members present were Earl Keller, A. J. Ressler, Werner Fornos, Jr., Robert Krause, Andrea Martin, and Becky Bartlett. The Secretary's minutes of the meeting of March 19, 2026, were approved as presented.

Earl Keller moved and A. J. Ressler seconded a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report and the Cash Disbursements for March 2026 and Open Invoices for April 2026. The motion passed unanimously.

The Engineer's Report for March 2026 was approved as presented.

The Financial Report for January 1, 2026, to March 31, 2026, was approved as presented.

The Superintendent of Operations' report for March 2026 was approved as presented.

The Office Administrator's report for March 2026 was approved as presented.

Becky Bartlett moved and Andrea Martin seconded a motion to approve the payment to Eastern Time for the Borough Hall Annex Project in the amount of \$47,871 for the first invoice and \$17,643 for the second invoice. The motion passed unanimously.

David Busch presented a memo on revising the by-laws of the Authority and was directed to proceed by the Chairman.

Andrea Martin moved and Earl Keller seconded a motion to approve the proposal for the performance T-Liner service for three years presented by Musson Brothers, Inc., a COSTARS bid. The motion passed unanimously.

After discussion, the Board authorized the Engineer to proceed with a storm water sewer system assessment of the Nazareth Borough storm water system.

Justin Huratiak appeared to discuss the NEST project and its expansion to include an additional 44 units, over the 88 units already approved. Mr. Huratiak also discussed tapping fees assessed for residential EDUs.

The Solicitor distributed to each Board member the draft Public Sewer Franchise Agreement submitted by Bushkill Township.

At the call of the Chairman, there was an executive session.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
