

   To satisfy this requirement: Letters must be written directly by a supervising adult (boss, troop leader, etc.) and sent with an application (NOT separately) no later than June 30, 2026.

The letter should include:

- 1) The name, title, email, and phone number of the supervising adult
- 2) Details of the student's participation
- The type of activities they engaged in
   The dates/date range of their participation
- Volunteer on behalf of a Fraternal Unit of the Moose, (verified with signature by Lodge Administrator,

Chapter Treasurer or Moose Legion Secretary on the application.) Application, transcripts, and supervisor letters/enclosures must be sent in as one submission. Do not send

each item separately.


