**Simon Peter wrote in his first book that very thing. That Jesus carried our heavy, dirty sins to the cross so that we might die to sin and live for righteousness. Verse 24 is that famous line, 'by His stripes we are healed'.**

**And Isaiah chapter 53 says that same thing, 'the punishment that brought us peace was upon Him, and by His stripes we are healed.' And there's more! 2nd Corinthians 5 : 21 , God made Him who knew no sin, talking about Jesus, to be sin on our behalf, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God.**

ACTOR 7 - Maddie

**Yes! And in Hebrews 9 : 28 , Christ was offered once to bear the sins of many, and He will appear a second time, not to bear sin, but to bring salvation to those who eagerly wait for Him!**

ACTOR 1 - Ms Elaine - AnnMarie

**Dying a human death, rising up because He is truly God, spending more time here on earth, and then going up to Heaven, it is hard for me to wrap my head around all of that, but Jesus did it for me. He did it for you and for me. Entering into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, having the last supper, being beaten, dying on the cross, all of it - it is more than enough!**
