Of First Importance: Salvation!

Several months ago, Kem Oun, a Garuna teacher, was baptized with three 6th grade Garuna Christian School students on the same day. It was an amazing salvation celebration and an exciting day for the entire church and school community! Let us share the story.

Miss Kem Oun had been involved in Prech Lutheran Church, led by Cambodian Pastor Bun Sopheab. The church is located next to the Garuna Christian School in Kampot where Pastor also teaches Bible classes for the Garuna Kids. Pastor had invited Kem Oun to participate in Garuna's Lutheran Institute Southeast Asia (LISA) Bible training program while she continued to live at home with her mother. Kem Oun considered herself to be a Christian, but she had never been baptized. Though her mother had given her permission to be a Christian, she had resisted the idea of her daughter being baptized. Kem Oun felt it important to honor her mother, so she patiently waited for that next step.

In the fall of 2020, there was an opening to teach at the Garuna Christian School next to her church, and she wanted to be involved in ministry with the children. By now, she had completed the LISA Bible class 2-year program for teachers, so she was hired. A few months after her new teaching position started, she was engaged to Mr. Suy Neang,

a Korean language instructor and a very open-minded young man. They were married soon after, and an exciting opportunity soon followed. Her mother agreed to her baptism, as did her husband who has a growing interest in Christianity, as well. She was then baptized with three Garuna students before the school/church Christmas outreach party last December.

We pray God's grace on Kem Oun and her husband as we celebrate this gift of baptism and salvation!

Reaching Young People!

The boys' and girls' teams celebrate their victories after the soccer tournament. They love this outreach activity which combines ministry and sport.

All over the world, the best ministry strategy is to listen to the local people and design ministry around their interests and needs.

Our Asia leaders know this, resulting in the formation of soccer teams which include worship and Bible study. Garuna now sponsors 5 teams in Cambodia, each connected to a Garuna school and designed for those who are 14-24 years old. There are four boys' teams and one girls' team. Channdet, Garuna's Education Coordinator and the coach shared, "This soccer ministry provides a chance for sharing the gospel, helping youth improve their health, and keeping them busy with good things." Recently the boys' and girls' teams from Kampong Chhnang competed in a national U18 Christian tournament in Phnom Penh, with the girls' team winning 1st place and the boys' team winning 4th place. The girls won prize money and decided to treat the boys to dinner at a favorite "hot pot" restaurant on their way home.

Of First Importance: Sunday School Outreach!

The Garuna Christian Schools are used for year-round school for students in Grades K-6, but are also designed to be multi-purpose, serving as a church plant, for Sunday School, youth activities, and for other community gatherings. At this point, all 7 of the schools now offer a Sunday School program and are seeing significant numbers of young people attending. We are so thankful for this open door for sharing the Gospel.

It wasn't long after Garuna's 7th school opened in Phnom Penh, that nearly 100 students were meeting for Sunday School each week!




Of First Importance: Growing Church Communities!

The holidays are an ideal time to share the Gospel with friends and families in Southeast Asia. Whether it's part of an English teaching ministry or at a Garuna Christian School, everyone loves to have a gathering, fellowship, and to learn about the holiday's origins. Activities are centered around the reasons for the seasons, such as Christmas and Easter. For most of Asia, there is little to no knowledge about how these holidays are related to the



life of Christ and the difference it makes in our lives.

Most of the activities emphasize a joint church-school focus, inviting the community onto the church and school sites.

An egg decorating activity in Bangkok leads to a discussion of the Resurrection and the open tomb. At the Into Light English Language Center, Director Ar helps many students in Bangkok learn about the meaning of Easter for the first time!

including a new photo and information about the child's family, grade level, etc. Much of this is shared with the sponsors of these students in their annual brochures. Upon enrollment, their religion and baptism status reveal that

nearly all the students come from Buddhist families and are not baptized.

As an example, Garuna Christian School #7 opened in Phnom Penh last November with 162 students registered. 100% were listed as Buddhist and not baptized. What an opportunity to share Jesus with 162 grade K-6

During this time of COVID and quarantines, it was not possible to attend a large group Bible study. And so, Pastor Niran, Garuna's LISA coordinator in Thailand, has adjusted by developing a weekly online Bible study. He has divided the 20 participants into 5 groups which includes whole group online study, followed by a small group study to dig more deeply into the Word with a more experienced teacher.
