The Ministry of the Luther Institute Southeast Asia (LISA)

Indigenous Leadership Training

Garuna's number one objective is to train indigenous leaders so that they may be equipped by God to share His Word and lead the new churches in their own countries. The way that is done differs by country and circumstances. In some areas, students gather for 1-week intensives and then go back to their homes and ministries to use what they've learned. In other cases, the students meet weekly. In some locations, students may need to travel to a region in which they may study more freely. And even more practically, the teachers are beginning to use online resources to share with students via YouTube, Facebook, or other means. Thailand, especially, makes use of the internet to stream teaching for others to use. This is an area of new development and opportunity as Garuna plans for the future. The class gatherings have been temporarily suspended during

Meet Pastor Niran-

Pastor Niran Temsakun is a pastor and leader in the Thailand Concordia Lutheran Church (TCLC) and serves as the Country Coordinator for the Luther Institute Southeast Asia (LISA) in Thailand. After completing the 4-year program LISA program himself, he now works closely with his wife, Esther, to train and mentor the other young leaders from northern Thailand. He has a heart for new church plants and currently oversees 3 churches and 5 preaching stations in this part of the country.

Pastor Niran grew up as a Buddhist and served as a monk at a temple in Chiang Mai. At age 17, his sister shared the Gospel with him. He was surprised to learn that Jesus could forgive him of his sins. Until that time, he had been taught that reincarnation gives you multiple opportunities to reach perfection. He had never heard the Bible's message of forgiveness before that day.

An excellent mentor and guide for his LISA students, Niran loves to give them opportunities to practice and apply what they've been studying. In addition to the local ministries, he and his assistants travel to more remote borders of the country to meet and train students from bordering regions who have travel freedom. This model extends the ministry into multiple countries in this part of the world. The students can then they take what they've learned and apply it immediately to their ministries.

Pastor Niran shared, "I've learned about Lutheran doctrine and how to serve and teach my students through LISA and the good professors who teach us. I'm so blessed by Garuna's support. It's not just about a salary, but I have been encouraged to pray and to develop my ministry through the LISA program. I like the way that Garuna helps and supports this goal of church planting."

Garuna exists to help and encourage the planting of churches, including national Lutheran Church bodies. It was a great joy to see the local church leaders gather on January 31 and February 1 of 2020 to sign the constituting documents for a national Cambodian Lutheran Church (CLC). There were approximately 37 who gathered from all over the country, representing 16 churches, 29 preaching stations, 1698 church members (children, youth, and adults). This is a huge step in the life of this very young church body and a great reason to rejoice!
