## Baptisms

It is a joy to witness baptisms which result from ministry of the local, indigenous staff. On this trip, 28 individuals

were baptized, including youth group teenagers, Garuna School students, a Garuna School teacher, and even a teacher's child. We pray that they cling to this cross and the promise of life eternal – and that many more in Asia come to a saving faith, as well. We thank Mr. Bill Hodgson, a retired teacher from Christ Lutheran-Phoenix, who supplied handmade wooden crosses for all of those who were baptized.

A 3-day teacher training retreat was a major focus of the mission trip. Teachers from all six of the Garuna Schools gathered with our 14-member USA team. Our theme was "Growing in Grace and Knowledge" (2 Peter 3:18) and we emphasized the importance of physical, cognitive, emotional, and spiritual growth in our schools and in our personal lives.



One of the retreat projects was the decorating of a canvas pencil pouch. The Cambodian teachers are great artists! At the final devotion, the USA teachers filled their pencil bags with items that could be used by the teachers, but they also attached a Bible verse to each item. The packet of tissue given to them was a reminder of God's ability to wipe away their tears of sorrow, but also proved quite useful when the tearful goodbyes resulted at the end of our time together!

## Luther Institute Southeast Asia (LISA) Updates

LISA continues to be a vital ministry of Garuna. Classes and training events are scheduled regularly throughout the Southeast Asia region. Recently, LISA's Director of Operations, Rev. Dr. Mark Schroeder, taught a LISA course in Phnom Penh on the "Means of Grace". A few weeks

prior to that class, Rev. Dr. Timothy Dost of Concordia Seminary in St. Louis taught an Introduction to the Book of Concord, which was recently translated into the Khmer language by the Lutheran Heritage Foundation (LHF). LISA serves a critical role in the training of the leaders of the emerging Lutheran Churches in Southeast Asia and the teachers and leaders of the Garuna Christian Schools in Cambodia.

## Future Garuna Christian Schools (GCS)

Garuna is prayerfully moving forward with plans to build two more Garuna Christian Schools in Cambodia in the next two years – God-willing and to His glory. The seventh GCS is in process and will be built near the capital city of Phnom Penh. It will be a two-story, six-classroom building that is easily accessible to the airport and can be utilized for LISA training. It is designed to enroll 200 students and serve as a new church plant for the Cambodia Lutheran Church (CLC). Please pray for God's blessing on this important ministry project.



Garuna is also prayerfully looking at purchasing land for our eighth school. We are looking at placing a second school in the Siem Reap area, which we hope will become a center for training and ministry in this region of Cambodia. Please pray that this project may have a tremendous impact for the Gospel in this area.
