Tacoma Urban Performing Arts Center offers preprofessional classical ballet education, other multicultural classical dance development and training for youth ages 6-18 who might otherwise have little to no access and exposure to the classical arts. Instruction and preprofessional training opportunities are taught by world class visiting artists from the Dance Theater of Harlem, Alvin Alley Dance Company, Pacific Northwest Ballet, Spectrum Theater. Students are also exposed to professional theater, opera and other classical music and art forms. Recognized by the City of Tacoma for its innovative community outreach, T.U.P.A.C. has meaningful collaborations and partnerships with Tacoma Art Museum, Tacoma Public Schools, Tacoma Ethnic Fest, Tacoma Arts Commission and more.
