Meeting was over at 9:10pm.






This Month's Meeting October 10th

Chaplains Corner

In our last newsletter I set forth what *Truth is not*. Should you pick up a newspaper, Watch the new on TV, or scan Social media it seems as if we have been painted as Klansmen, Racists, Fascists, Bigots, White Supremist, Neo-Nazi, and a new word, Neo-Confederate. These words are thrown around like confetti at a New Year's Eve party.

But again, we have to look back and see what *Truth is not* and then compare it to what truth really is. In John 18: 33-38, a very interesting conversation between the Truth and Pilate took place. "Therefore Pilate entered again into the Praetorium, and summoned Jesus and said to Him, 'Are You the King of the Jews?' Jesus answered, 'Are you saying this on your own initiative, or did others tell you about Me?' Pilate answered, 'I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests delivered You to me; what have You done?' Jesus answered, 'My kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world, then My servants would be fighting so that I would not be handed over to the Jews, but as it is, My kingdom is not of this realm.' Therefore, Pilate said to Him, 'So You are a king?' Jesus answered, 'You say correctly that I am a king. For this I have been born, and for this I have come into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears My voice.' Pilate said to Him, 'What is the truth?'"

Pilate's question, "What is the truth?" has reverberated down through history. Was it a melancholy desire to know what no one else could tell him, a cynical insult, or perhaps an irritated, indifferent reply to Jesus' words?

Philosophy tells us there are three simple ways to define truth: 1. Truth is that which corresponds to reality. 2. Truth is that which matches its object. 3. Truth is simply telling it like it is

There are a number of philosophies and worldviews that challenge the concept of truth, yet, when each is examined it turns out to be self-defeating in nature. Without putting everyone to sleep, I'll make this short and get to the point. There is relativism, skepticism, postmodernism, and the most popular today, pluralism (which says that all truth claims are equally valid).

The spirit behind pluralism is an open-armed attitude of tolerance. Pluralism states that all people may be equal, but not all truth claims are. Pluralism fails to understand the difference between opinion and truth.

As Christian apologist Ravi Zacharias puts it, "*The fact is the truth matters-especially when you're on the receiving end of a lie.*"

Clyde Wilson, Professor Emeritus of History at the University of South Carolina, when addressing the 13th Annual Gettysburg Banquet of the J.E.B. Stuart Camp SCV, Philadelphia puts out some interesting facts that will support the idea of truth.

"We human beings are peculiar creatures, half angel and half animal, as someone has said. Alone among creatures we have a consciousness of ourselves, of our situation, and our movement through time. We have language, and by symbols can communicate knowledge to one another and across generations.

We can learn something about humans from the Divine Revelations in the Bible. We can also learn something by scientific examination of our physical selves. Most of what we know about human beings is in our knowledge of the past. As a philosopher puts it: we must live forward but we can only think backward. I am, of course making a plea for the importance of history, or to be more exact, historical memory, something that is undergoing catastrophic destruction today in the United States.

We sons of Confederate soldiers are especially fortunate in our forefathers. They not only won a place in the hearts of us, their descendants. They also won the lasting admiration of everyone in the civilized world who values courage, skill, sacrifice, and an indomitable spirit in defense of freedom. That is why our battle-flag, which is being suppressed in these United States, appeared spontaneously at the fall of the Berlin Wall and among peoples celebrating their liberation from the Soviet Empire."






National News - Virginia Monuments



A Charlottesville Circuit Judge has issued rulings that DENIED the city's request to dismiss the lawsuits filed to prevent removal, ruled that the monument IS, in fact, covered by state law, asked for more documentation to confirm it's a war memorial, and left the injunction preventing removal in place!!

Partial victory and more delays, all the while preventing removal, is a GREAT day for the citizens of the Commonwealth... and a huge loss for the haters on City Council.

It's not over yet. The judge gave the plaintiffs 21 days to provide additional evidence to support the fact that the monument is a war memorial.

21 days to prove that the 14' bronze statutes of **WAR** Between The States Generals...in full military gear...on their **WAR** horses...in **WAR** Between the States period tack... are in fact **WAR** Memorials.


Meanwhile, the monuments remain and momentum to push back against the monument destroyers continues to build, and his ruling today that monuments are RETRO-ACTIVELY covered by state law should serve to quell the isolated monument removal rumblings across the Commonwealth.

"... the judge said he could not conclude that the General Assembly intended to leave certain memorials unprotected based on when they were built and whether they were built in a city or a county. 'Logic and common sense prevent me from reaching such a conclusion,' Moore wrote."

Logic and common sense...refreshing!

No ruling was issued today on the issue of the (illegal) tarps, which remain on the monuments.


