When the call went out in 1861 for Texas troops to serve in Virginia, Texans rushed to volunteer for what became the 1st, 4th, and 5th Texas Infantry Regiments--collectively, Hood's Texas Brigade. The town of Independence raised three companies for the 5th Texas.

Located in the heart of the richest cotton-growing county in the Lone Star State, Independence was just a dozen miles from Washington-on-the-Brazos, where Texas independence had been declared 25 years before. Company I of the 5th Texas was one of the three Independence companies. As part of the 5th Texas and Hood's Texas Brigade, Company I served in all the great battles of the Army of Northern Virginia from Gaines Mill to Appomattox - with its hardest fights at Second Manassas and at Gettysburg.

Back in Independence, citizens did what they could to support the troops and waited anxiously for news of them. This is the story of those who went to war in Company I and of those who waited for them back home in Independence.

Steve Woodworth is one of our favorite historians. He is always prepared, eloquent, entertaining, and a nationally recognized expert on the Civil War. We are fortunate to have him in Fort Worth. So you have the perfect combination - excellent topic and a great speaker. This would be a good opportunity to bring a guest. See you on the 12th!



## *Chaplains Corner - Going Home*

John 14:1-3: “Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in in God, believe in me. In my Father’s house are many mansions: If it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also.”

We are preparing to celebrate Christmas, the birthday of our Lord and Savior and many of us will be traveling home to visit parents and likewise, our children and grand children will be coming home to us. I have been listening to a beautiful song that Mary Fahl sang for the movie *Gods and Generals* called “Going Home”. The lyrics and tune that reached into my Southern soul as to remind me of what the fight was all about.

*They say there’s a place where dreams have all gone  
They never said where but I think I know  
It’s miles through the night just over the dawn  
On the road that will take me home  
I know in my bones, I’ve been here before  
The ground feels the same though the land’s been torn  
I’ve a long way to go the stars tell me so  
On tis road that will take me home  
And when I pass by, don’t lead me astray  
Don’t try to stop me, don’t stand in my way  
I’m bound for the hills where cool waters flow  
On this road that will take me home*



The Southern contemporary author, Dr. James Everett Kibler, writes keenly on home and the meaning of it in one of his novels *Walking Toward Home*. One of the character by the name of Kildee says: “Guess the best thing dirt roads do...is they slow people down. The world’s too much in a hurry, and usually with no place to go. Everything flies by in a blur. And people get to where they don’t belong anywhere and ain’t from no place at all.”

It seems that dirt roads take you home. Interstate highways take you to traffic jams.

No one doubts that the North was (and still is) a navigation society, the South a (and still is) agrarian society. A quote from *Memory’s Keep*, “Those who travel seldom come home holy.” Holden Caulfield from *Catcher in the Rye* did not, nor did Yankee commercial ships. Travelers necessarily leave their homes, and with it, part of their souls.

My home is in Ft. Worth. This is where my wife, Karol, was born and raised. I sit on the back porch with a canopy of trees shading while providing for the blue jays, red birds, robins, a nest for squirrels. I hear the tapping of an occasional woodpecker, the cooing of a dove, and the soaring of a hawk high above. My two dogs alternately sleeping and watching me watch them, then occasionally bolting and chasing after a squirrel taking a short cut. My two boys (young men now) will be home for Christmas.

My home is also in Mississippi. That is where my roots are. My Mom left a foundation that unfortunately she was unable to complete. Kyle completed what was left undone. Mom and Dad are now at rest in Hutto, their graves facing East toward Mississippi and the rising sun. There is a place there for me when I “cross over the river”. Not only will we be facing the rising sun, will all will be facing Mississippi. We will be smiling, for where we are and where we will be and what we will see. The South will always be my home.

May the Lord bless and keep you may His face shine on you. May the Lord be gracious to you turn to you and give you peace. Gather you in His arms, never let you go. Keep you safe from harm, God be with you.



## *VA Flaggers News*



A much-disputed Confederate flag that stands on private property does not violate Stafford County's zoning ordinance and can continue to fly high above Interstate 95, county officials have determined.

The Virginia Flaggers, a group that raises roadside Confederate battle flags around the state, put up the Stafford flag in 2014. While officials fielded some initial complaints and objections. For weeks, the flag dominated public comments during meetings of the Stafford County Board of Supervisors.

On Sept. 19, county attorney Charles Shumate stated Stafford could not legally force the flag's removal. That same day, at least two people, including Garrisonville attorney Patricia Healy and Stafford resident Patricia Joshi, filed a zoning complaint contending the flag was actually a sign that violated the county's zoning ordinance.

County staff investigated the claim and determined that there had been no zoning violation, Stafford Planning and Zoning Director Jeff Harvey told Joshi in a voicemail late last month.

Harvey did not elaborate on the decision and county officials did not respond Tuesday to an inquiry about the determination.

In her Sept. 19 complaint, Healy, who is also a member of the Stafford School Board, wrote that the flag was designed to promote "services, beliefs, events and activities of the Virginia Flaggers," an organization that has put up more than two dozen roadside Confederate flags and solicits donations on its website and Facebook page. <http://www.vaflaggers.com/i95flagdonate.html>

Because signs in the zoning district where the flag flies can stand no more than six feet high, "our firm suggests this structure is an illegal sign," according to a copy of the complaint provided to The Free Lance–Star paper.

The flagpole in question is 80 feet tall.

Joshi said she was disappointed in the county's finding, but that more challenges to the flag are likely.

Shumate, the county attorney, has said that the Confederate flag is protected by the First Amendment right to free speech. The Virginia Flaggers legally obtained a permit from the county to raise the flag.

Any future action by the county to set limits on flag heights would not affect the one visible from I–95. It would be grandfathered under the existing ordinance, Shumate has said.

## *Update on the Texas Scottish Festival and Highland Games*



So sorry for the delays of information. Let me update what has been happening behind the scenes.

Before any of this began, we had started a transition process that would allow me to retire and allow the Festival to continue with younger leadership. We will be in good hands. Now the updates....

First we were completely caught off guard by UTA's decision to 'boot' us off campus. We had a 'gentlemen agreement' that any major changes would be with a two-year notice so that we would be able adjust budgets accordingly. They would not allow that and in fact we are lucky we had the last one at Maverick Stadium. And they did not make that easy on us charging 20% + more and you know what a fiasco they made of the parking.

The new team did a GREAT job and we thought we had an agreement with the City of Plano for same dates at the Balloon Festival site. They were going to pay costs due to the move and other considerations. A Plano official even attended the event at UTA and was thrilled with the preliminary agreement. We were very happy. They strung us out saying final has to be approved by City Council, etc. so we waited not wanting to announce anything until official. Well seems that 'Scottish' was not the flavor of the month (think statue removals in area) and we were dropped like a hot potato. Very disappointing.

## *Confederate Armament*


Many guns were buried or dumped in the river to keep them out of enemy hands.



Because of their rounded contours, Dahlgren guns were nicknamed

"soda bottles"

**Both guns would have been part of a river front battery and used for city defense.**



Whistling Dick was a banded and rifled 18-pound Confederate siege and garrison cannon that was originally casted as a Model 1839 smoothbore. It earned its name by a peculiar whistling sound made by projectiles fired from the gun. The cannon was an integral part of the Confederate defenses protecting Vicksburg and the Mississippi River and during the 1863 siege of Vicksburg and is credited with sinking the Union gunboat *Cincinnati*. The cannon believed to be Whistling Dick fell into Union hands with the July 4<sup>th</sup> surrender of Vicksburg and it was soon shipped to trophy point at the United States Military Academy West Point, New York. During the ensuing decades, questions about the authenticity of the cannon were raised; chief among them was a story as told by one of the former gun-crew that surfaced in 1900. He claimed that on the night of July 3<sup>rd</sup> 1863 a detail of 14 Confederate soldiers moved the cannon from its firing position on Wymans Hill to the old Vicksburg waterfront. There it was transferred to a coal barge, paddled into the main channel of the Mississippi River and dumped overboard. Finally, some 100 years later, it was discovered that the cannon shipped to West Point was not Whistling Dick, but actually a similar cannon known as the Widow Blakely. Geological analysis of available this and other historic information indicates two possible locations for Whistling Dick, Centennial Lake or a loess cave on Wymans Hill. In 1863 the Mississippi River did flow in front of Vicksburg, but in 1876 a cutoff occurred (Centennial Cutoff) isolating Vicksburg from the river and forming a shallow oxbow lake, located just west of Vicksburg, Ms. Whistling Dick weighed about 2.5 tons and while the logistics of movement might have been difficult, a river location is plausible. Alternately, burial of the cannon in a loess cave on or near Wymans Hill is another possibility. Although numerous loess caves were known to exist in this area, there is no documentation either substantiated or unsubstantiated indicating such a fate for the cannon. In conclusion, neither hypothesis adequately explains the disappearance of Whistling Dick. However, given the size of the cannon, advanced geophysical techniques may be able to locate a magnetic or gravity anomaly produced by the cannon.




