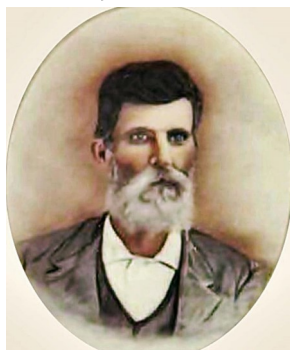
Chaplain's Corner

My Grandmother used to say that trouble comes in threes. But who did the counting? You've probably noticed that acknowledging and investigating troubles seem to make them multiply. Right now, I'm considering our house. Cracks started appearing on the tile flooring and along the walls and in the master bath. Water was leaking into the living room from the cracks in shower floor. My patching with caulk only seemed to worsen the problem. In short, all the repair bills and rebuilding and remodeling are costing as much as the house when we purchased it about thirty years ago. Obviously, ignoring problems also makes them multiply. Ignoring the leak today leads to the living room ceiling sitting in your lap tomorrow. So, you face a dilemma: If your troubles multiply whether you examine or ignore them, what should you do? King Jehoshaphat found himself face-to-face with trouble. A huge army marched toward Jerusalem, and the scouting reports didn't hold out much hope. The problem on the horizon promised to be enormous by the time it reached the king. "Alarmed," we read, "Jehoshaphat resolved to inquire of the Lord" (2 Chronicles 20:3). He looked through the trouble. Faced with an overwhelming situation, the king immediately turned to Someone who is never overwhelmed. As we face trouble in our own lives, our prayer can be like Jehoshaphat's: "Lord, I know you're in charge. So, I choose to recognize this trouble as your problem, not just mine. I admit that I can't handle this situation, yet it needs to be resolved. What do you say, Lord?" Notice how God responded to this prayer of faith. He answered, but he didn't promise to help Judah win the battle. Instead, he said he'd fight for his people. Could the king have anticipated this answer? There are times in our lives as well when God's good answers surprise us. But notice also that the king still had his marching orders: God told him not to be afraid (twice), not to be discouraged (twice), to march out, to take positions and go out and face the enemy. By the time the people had completed God's instructions, the battle was over. Again, we face a dilemma. We often find ourselves a little too close to our troubles-so close that we end up wallowing in them. Or we find ourselves trying to avoid troublesgiving them the opportunity to pull a surprise attack. But God calls us to trust him, to look through our troubles and toward him.

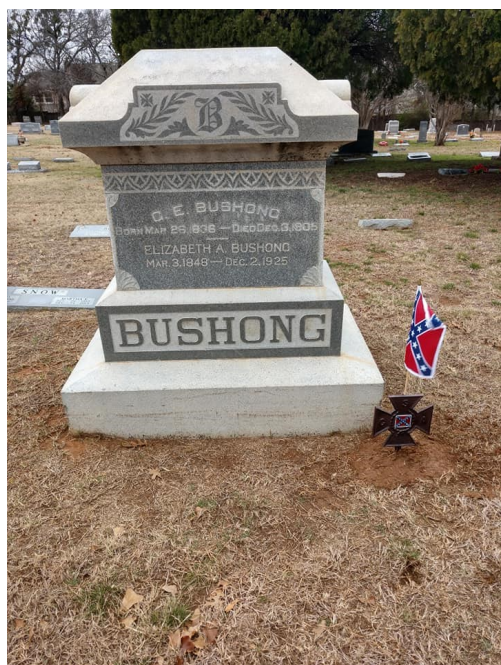


Camp 2292 News - Remembering a Ancestor of James Turnage

Street Address: 3205 N 41st Street, Orange, Texas 77632 (The “Blue House”)

This is the address of the house directly across 41st Street from the Memorial. It is owned by 10th Brigade Cmdr Hank Van Slyke and it is being remodeled. From here it is just a few steps out the front door to the Memorial. You are all welcome to come inside and relax. There are two bathrooms, a refrigerator with cold drinks, snacks in the kitchen, and chairs for resting.

Parking: There will be flaggers directing vehicles to park either on the Park property or in the United Steel Workers lot next to the Blue House. Motorcycles can park anywhere on the Park, or in the yard of the Blue House.

- Carpooling is encouraged, due to the limited parking space.

Note: There are “No Parking” signs all around the Memorial property. Do not park along any street.

Hotels: Two are recommended, for their location, price and comfort.

The Hampton and the Days Inn. Both are on the north side of I-10, just east of the Park. Easy access to the Park, just stay on the service road, turn right at MLK, left at the next street (Bancroft) and look for the flaggers. Preview it on Google maps.

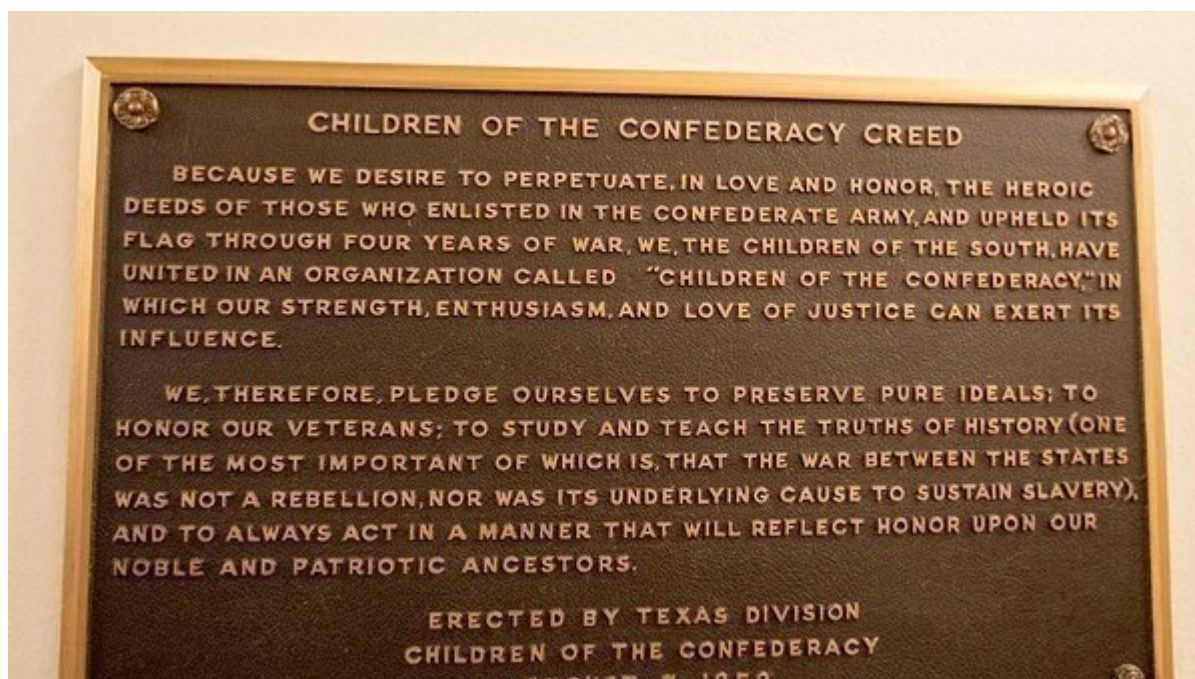

A Update from the Virginia Flaggers - VA House Bill 2377

We have been monitoring the Virginia General Assembly closely for any new monument legislation introduced, and learned today of House Bill #2377, introduced by Del. Toscano (D-Charlottesville). His bill would gut our Veterans Memorial Protection Law, allowing ultra-liberal local governments like his own to remove and destroy monuments at the whim of their extremist leaders and constituents.

You may recall that Toscano and others tried to introduce 6 bills effecting our monuments in the 2018 session. All died in committee, thanks to a robust response from citizens, and a slim Republican majority in both houses.

We will be keeping a close eye on this bill and any others that are introduced and will keep you informed of any changes and when action is needed.

In the meantime, now is a good time for everyone to contact their local, state and federal representatives, no matter where you live, and remind them that monuments are important to you.

Ask them to 1) Vote AGAINST any legislation that would allow for monument removal...and 2) Vote FOR any legislation that would protect them.

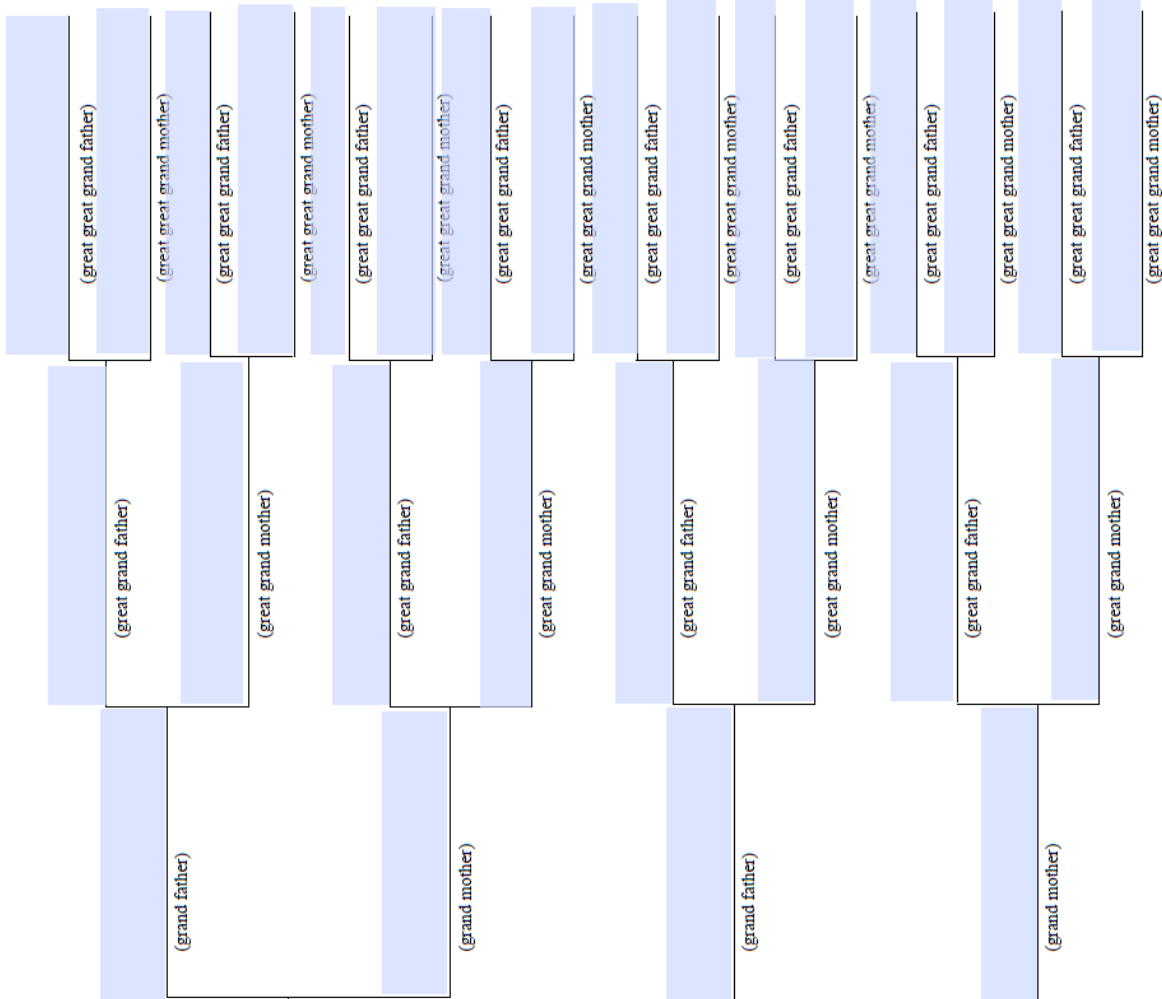

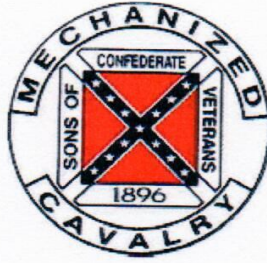

CHARGE TO THE SONS OF CONFEDERATE VETERANS

“To you, Sons of Confederate Veterans, we will commit the vindication of the cause for which we fought.
