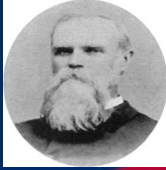

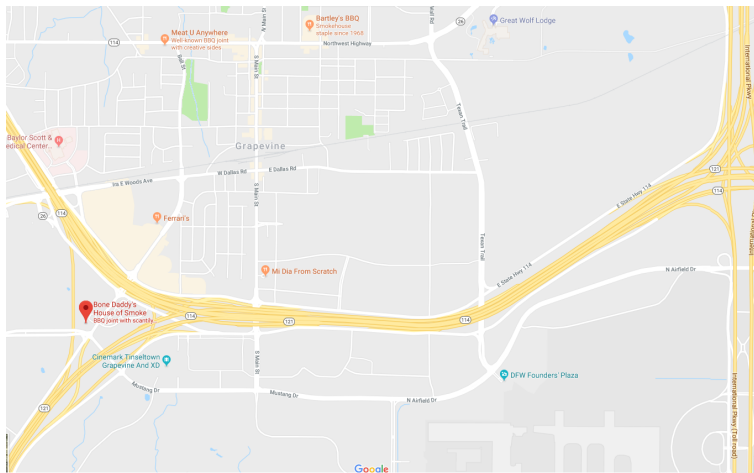

Chaplain's Corner - Reflections

"Dad, what is the hardest thing about writing?"

"The first word." He replied, as he sat facing his IBM Selectric typewriter staring at a blank page, and then his fingers began the rhythmic clack, clack, clack and the words another speech began to appear as the platen began rolling upward. On occasion, I attended political rallies and I listened to his words delivered by candidates for political office produce laughter, and cheers from crowds gathered.

Please forgive me for some "Woolgathering" and departing from the style of most of my *Chaplain's Corner* messages, but I'm really hurting inside. As a youth, I spent a great deal of time in Austin while Dad was doing "campaign stuff"; therefore, I was left alone to explore the Capitol, inside and outside. I loved the monuments! Each monument, to my eyes, was grand in appearance, grand in size and oh so beautifully done. Thinking that whatever each monument represents must have been created to memorialize a great deed or sacrifice. I thought that MY MONUMENTS would always be there. Well, I was wrong.

I make no excuses for my Southern Heritage. I don't consider myself a racist, white supremacist, white nationalist, or bigot. I'm also a follower of Jesus Christ and this runs through my Southern Heritage going all the way back to Ireland. There were four great, great uncles that fought for the South in the War for Southern Independence (from the great State of Mississippi), were planters and slave owners to help with the family farm. There are no pictures of them, that I can find, and the only monument to them are those monuments that exemplify the sacrifice of all Southern Confederate soldiers.

Supposing all monuments are removed, then what is left? Mayor Mike Rawlings said, "Wouldn't that send a powerful message of what Dallas is if we removed this 65-foot monument." Well, what do ya'll want Dallas to be? How about going further by tearing down the Book Depository Building and Dealey Plaza where President Kennedy was assassinated? Did anything change in Dallas when Robert E. Lee and Lone Rider were removed besides the landscape? Think about it.

I've come to believe that to some people Confederate Monuments, the Alamo Cenotaph, San Jacinto Battlefield, the Battleship Texas are just "things" to look at as we walk by. But, as I have found, in each monument there lies beneath its bronze, and granite a story that each one would agree honor, sacrifice, duty, loyalty, fraternity, and giving of yourself to serve at the cost of your own life.

We, as Sons of Confederate Veterans, Order of Confederate Rose, and UDC, may be the only ones left to perpetuate the cause and tell the truth about the Cause for Southern Independence. As Texas becomes a State of people from different cultures and countries can we expect them to focus and become interested in the truth about the War for Southern Independence? Can we rely on our State Legislature to pass a Monument protection Act? Can we expect schools to open their doors to members of the SCV to speak to students about the Cause? Can we develop a group of willing speakers who will volunteer to go into the public schools and teach students the truth of Southern Secession?

I am cheered up by reports of large flags going up and the work of the Flaggers, Saljo's, the thumbs up at the flag line during the Stocks Show, the Dallas Market Hall Gun Show, Veterans Day Parade in Grapevine, and the Scottish Festival. We should not let the events in Dallas, the Irish Festival, and Identity Politics around this country cause us to withdraw in our efforts to continue our fight for Southern Heritage.

We must not let hate or uncontrolled anger overtake our actions, thoughts, and words. Remember, Our Lord gives us these victories according to His perfect will, and he will always answer our prayers in His time and plan. "Let not your heart be troubled and seek first the Kingdom of God."

Update on the North Texas Irish Festival

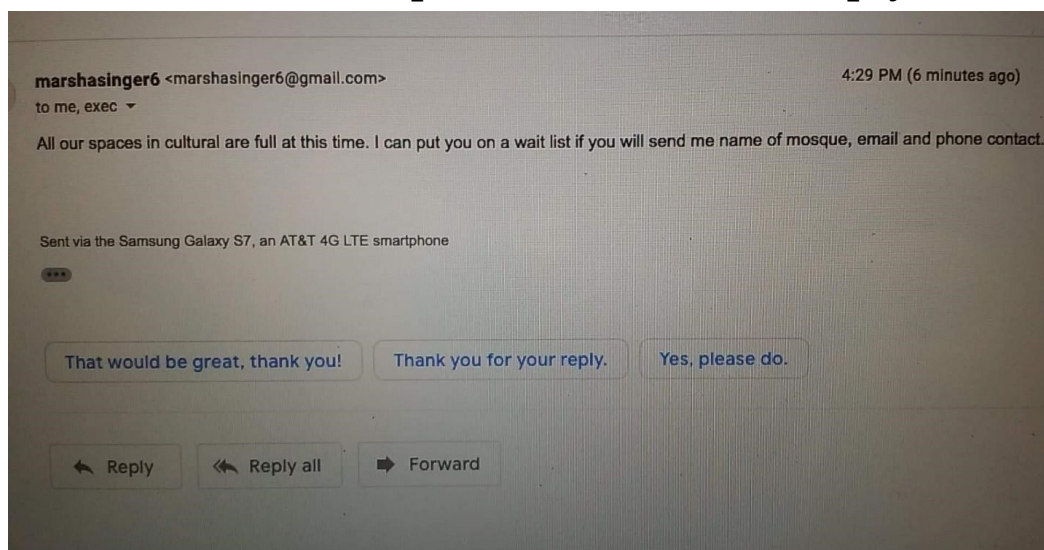

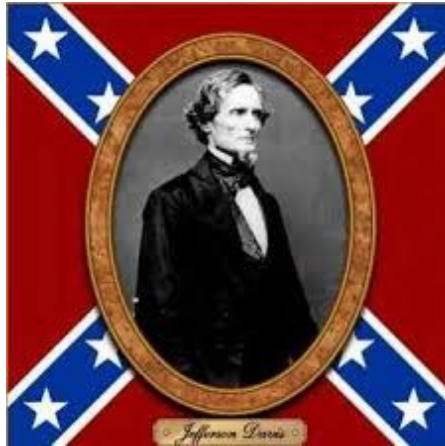

“True patriotism sometimes requires of men to act exactly contrary, at one period, to that which it does at another, and the motive which impels them the desire to do right is precisely the same.”

“We poor sinners need to come back from our wanderings to seek pardon through the all-sufficient merits of our Redeemer. And we need to pray earnestly for the power of the Holy Spirit to give us a precious revival in our hearts and among the unconverted.”

“I can only say that I am nothing but a poor sinner, trusting in Christ alone for salvation,”

“In all my perplexities and distresses, the Bible has never failed to give me light and strength.”

“It is well that war is so terrible, or we should grow too fond of it.”

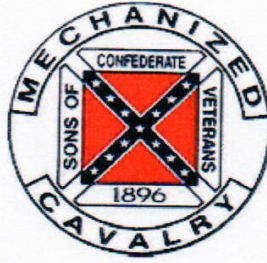
