## *Chaplains Corner* - Who is Your Daddy?

“But it is because the LORD loves you and is keeping the oath that he swore to your fathers, that the LORD has brought you out with a mighty hand and redeemed you.” Deuteronomy 7:8a

We don't know our Confederate ancestors very well, and I'd bet we'd like to know them better. Fortunately, I'm not that far removed from my Confederate ancestors. They were my Great Grandfather's uncles, and I can tell you about Regiments and battle actions, and that two were POWs. The family were “Planters” in Mississippi and that is about it. But do I really know them?

Ancestry.com did an estimated 1 billion dollars in sales last year and their DNA 23andMe has approximately 2 million DNA samples in their data base and use this to “discover what makes you uniquely you” by finding your ethnic mix, distant relatives, and ancestors. Other competing services promise that you can “uncover your heritage,” “find out where you really come from,” and “find new relatives.” Maybe I don't want to find any newer relatives.

Mark Vogl wrote in his book *Southern Fried Ramblings* and interesting observation: “That a conservative estimate would say one in six Americans are Southern by blood! First, the estimate assumes 500,000 as the number of Confederate veterans who had children. This reflects half of the actual number of Southerners who served, close to one million. And though 300,000 died during the war, many could have had sizeable families before the shots were fired at Ft. Sumter. Then one must estimate the number of children each veteran had. This estimate is six in the first post-veteran generation after the war. But if you only use five generations and the numbers of children per generation are as follows, six x five x four x four you come up with eighty million! Again, these numbers are based on half the number of men who fought for the south and one generation shy of what is living. So, the estimate is fairly conservative.”

“Eighty million Americans could be descendants of Confederate soldiers who fought for the South in the Great War. If just one of your grandparents was born in the South, the odds are in your favor you are kin to a Confederate soldier!”

We do not have our Confederate ancestors with us today to ask each one of them the “why” they fought in the War for Southern Independence. A good place to start is the Constitution of the Confederate States of America and compare it to the U.S. Constitution. And finally, read as many first-person source material and books as you can find.

The people of Israel did not need genealogical products and services. They knew their ancestors well. The prophets in the Old Testament kept reminding them of their heritage and the consequences of forgetfulness and transgression of God's laws. There was also the promise of a coming Messiah. The Gospel of Luke, Chapter 3, traces the genealogy of Jesus for 76 generations-76 generations! Luke traced Jesus's generations from Joseph all the way back to Adam.

Our Lord made a promise, not only to those in Israel, but to all men everywhere, “teaching them to observe all that I command you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age.” (Matthew 28:20)

## *Texas Division UDC News* - PLEASE WRITE LETTERS

Hello!

I would like to request assistance from the gentleman of the SCV to assist in the last call for vote about the Texas Confederate Woman's Home in Austin. It looks like we will have one remaining opportunity to speak/write in favor of keeping the State Antiquities Landmark (SAL) designation and keeping the Historical marker.

We received a SAL removal request from the Austin Group for the Elderly (AGE) wanting to remove the marker. They complain more about 3 years of operation by the UDC than the 110+ years of other ownership- trying to draw on a nerve of people at the Texas Historical Commission(THC). The letter outlines issues that are not true about the UDC and the building. For example during the last THC Antiquities meeting, Commissioners and staffers noted that this building is a fine, structurally intact early example of a building technique with concrete blocks, the building because of its unique purpose is a possible candidate for a National Register designation (the only Woman's Home west of the Mississippi), and an early example of female leadership prior to the suffrage movement among other items discussed.

The Antiquities committee voted unanimously to *deny* the removal request; however, the THC is allowing the full board to vote in April. The Travis County Historical Commission wants the designation and marker to STAY. The delay in the final Board vote will give AGE more time to have public comments that support removal of the designation and marker.

**The deadline is February 25** to get letters to the below addresses to be noted during the 30 day comment period. AGE may have been waiting until now before they say much, so we have to come forward with continued letters.

In the body of your statement, please note that you are replying during the public comment period along with your comments.

We need max effort to support this unique piece of Texas, Confederate History and our heritage. Together, we can keep Texas history!!

I thank you in advance for your assistance in this work to **KEEP** the SAL designation and the Marker at the Confederate Woman's Home.

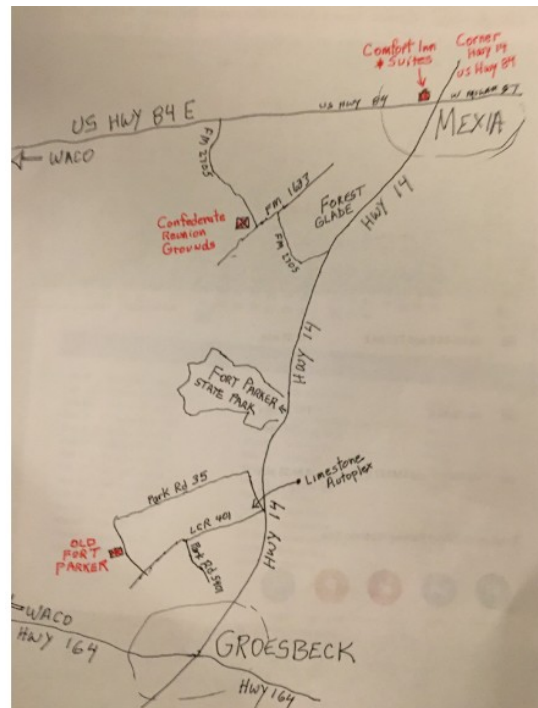

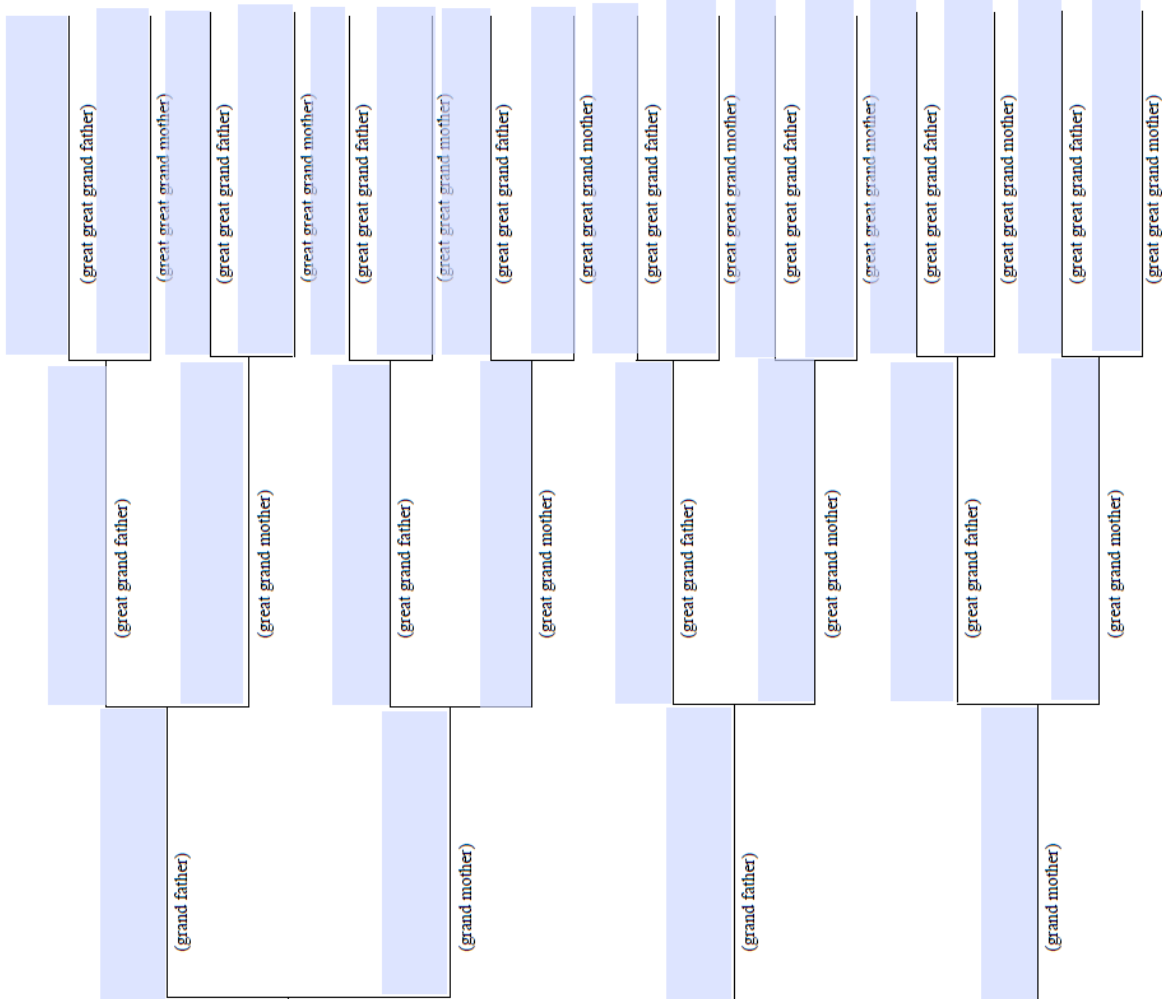

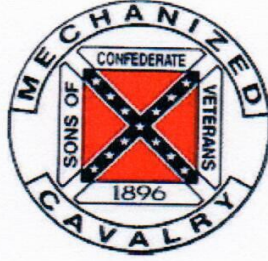
