Commanders Report

Compatriots!

Welcome to the camp’s first newsletter of 2023! In case you may not have heard, my name is Sean Par-tee and I was sworn in as the new Camp Commander of the Brigadier General Richard A. Gano SCV Camp 2292 at our camp’s Christmas celebration luncheon December 10th. I want to take a moment to thank Jack Bowen for the excellent job he did as Camp Commander these past two years. He, along with the other camp leadership, did some herculean efforts to keep our camp rolling in an efficient manner. For that, I appreciate the precedence he has set for me and future camp commanders to emulate.

January’s meeting is on the 17th at Chill’s in downtown Grapevine. At this meeting I would like to have an open discussion about the direction our camp is heading. I would specifically like to address my top three priorities for the camp that was derived from numerous discussions I have had with all of you.

They are:

1. **Membership:** This has always been the Achilles Heel not only for our camp, but for the SCV on the state and national level. For our camp I would like to address membership in terms of:
 - a. *Increasing our Numbers.* This is always a priority and is never ending.

Unfortunately, not enough members showed up to have a quorum to do so. So, Jack took the personal time to call members to get their individual votes to make this happen. This should not have happened, but it is where we are. It's been a persistent problem for some time now, and its one that needs addressing the most. **FOR OUR CAMP TO SURVIVE WE NEED MEMBERS TO SHOW UP!**
2. **Being Seen.** I would like to get more Gano members out to be seen by other SCV members and the general public.
 - a. *Locally.* I and others want to get back to the sidewalk clean up. I would also like to look at possibly volunteering for Grapevine events, such as Main Street Days and Grapefest. Jack did a great job of getting exposure for the camp by donating funds to the Grapevine Police Toy Drive. I hope we can continue with successes like that one.
 - b. *State and nationally.* I would hope more members might find the time and resources to attend other camp functions, such as monument dedications and banquets. Allen does a great job of attending re-enactments, which he is always extending an invitation for others to attend. Even if you do not want to participate, you can go for fellowship and encouragement. We had a good showing at this past Texas Division Reunion, so I hope we can continue to make our presence known!
 - c. *NOTE:* Frank does a great job of posting these things in the newsletter, so please look over them and see which ones you can participate in!
3. **Defending Our Heritage.** This may be somewhat controversial to mention here, but I would hope more of us can do more to voice our opposition to the outright war that has been declared on our Southern Heritage. This could be done in several ways to include writing your elected officials, donating to legal funds, and possibly even "flagging" when necessary. This is more of an individual choice to make but I hope that we, as a camp, could encourage each other to "hold the line."

Again, I would like to discuss these things at the upcoming January meeting. I have already heard some excellent suggestions which should be acted upon.

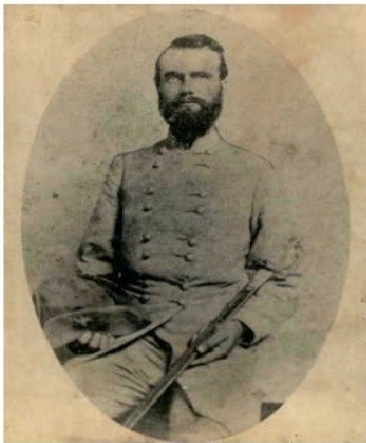

I designed a camp banner and I have ordered one. The design is below. I am hoping to have the banner to show the camp in person by the next meeting.

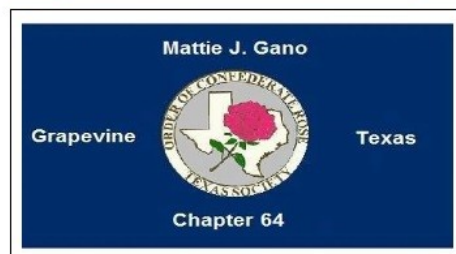
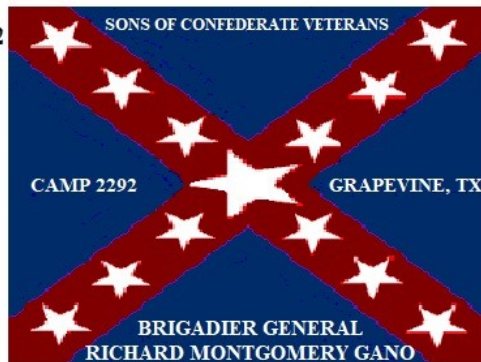

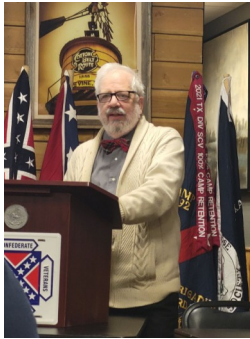

Chaplain's Corner

The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. He restores my soul. He leads me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me, your rod and your staff, they comfort me.

Psalm 23:1-4

Sheep are strange creatures, a sheep rancher told me. He said that sheep could be in a fenced in field with good green grass, water, and a good sturdy fence but if the fence were down the "head" sheep or ram would wander through the hole in the fence and move to a pasture with little grass, no water and wild animals around the rest of the flock would follow. Sheep are in a figurative shadow of potential harm and even death. They must rely on their shepherd to protect them and, when necessary, rescue them.

A shepherd in David's day would rely on his rod and staff. A rod was a club that resembled a walking stick, used to protect the sheep from predators and robbers. A staff was a longer piece of wood with a hook at one end and a spoon-shaped shovel at the other. The shepherd would use the hook to correct and re-direct sheep and, when necessary, to pull a sheep out of a hole, pit, or crevice. The shepherd would use the shovel to flick dirt or mud on a wandering sheep to guide it back to the rest of the flock.

Sheep were comforted by the rod and staff because they knew that their shepherd would use those tools to guide and protect them. Our Good Shepherd, Jesus, has much greater tools, as explained in the hymn *Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing* by Robert Robinson.

Jesus sought me when a stranger, wandering from the fold of God.
He, to rescue me from danger, brought me with his precious blood...
...Oh, to grace how great a debtor Daily I'm constrained to be!
Let Thy goodness, like a fetter, bind my wandering heart to Thee.
Prone to wander, Lord, I feel it, prone to leave the God I love.
Here's my heart, Oh take and seal it; seal it for Thy courts above.

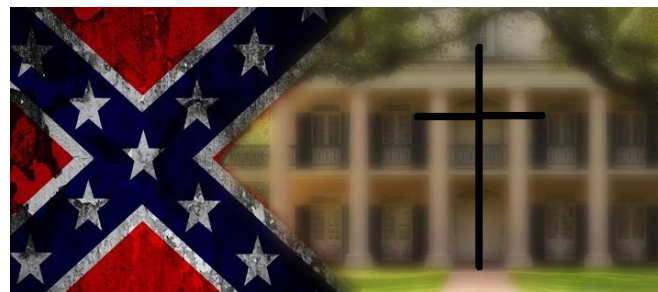

First I want to thank the people of Jacksonville for the warm welcome as I walked your streets with my Confederate Battle flag this morning (06 DEC). I look forward to coming back soon.

But now let's get down to cases. Mr. Mayor: Flying a flag over a football game with a legitimate and reasonable position on historic monuments is not "HATE." Hate *is* social media threats, verbal insults and threats by cancel culture activists. which is constantly aimed at the Heritage community. Accusing us of "hate" while ignoring anti-monument haters does not further an amicable resolution of monument issues.

And to the Florida Times Union, using 1/3 of a century old Southern Poverty Law Center distortions of SSH FL Spokesman Kirk D. Lyons' early career in your recent "hit piece" are not helpful. *Anyone* that knows Kirk D. KNOW that he is not a "white supremacist," - as his many clients of African ancestry and any of my fellow Black Confederate colleagues who know Kirk D. as a fair, Christian gentleman, can attest.

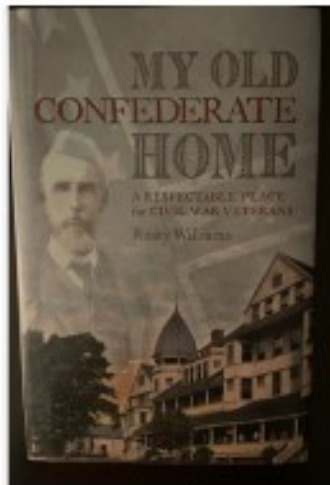

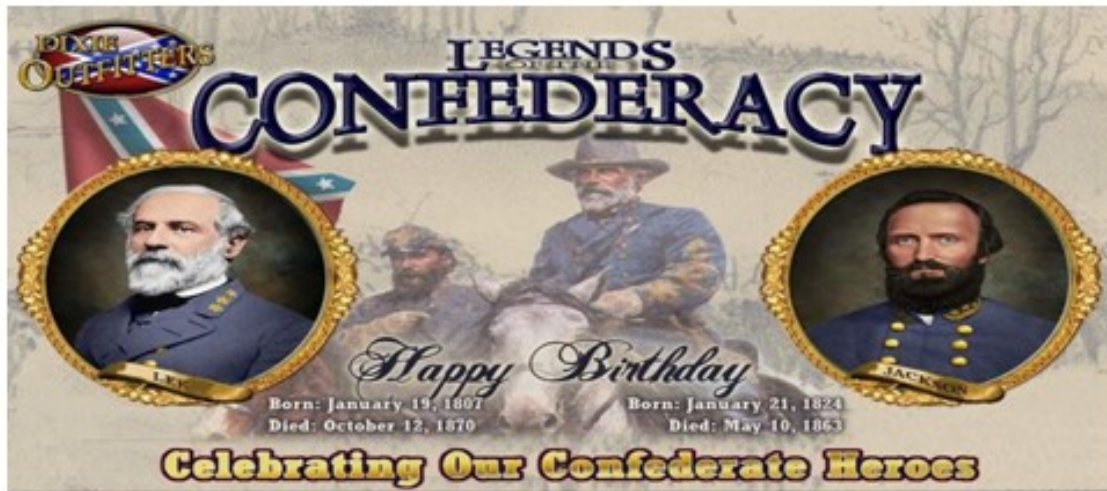

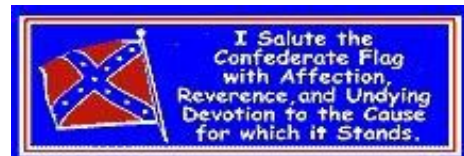
