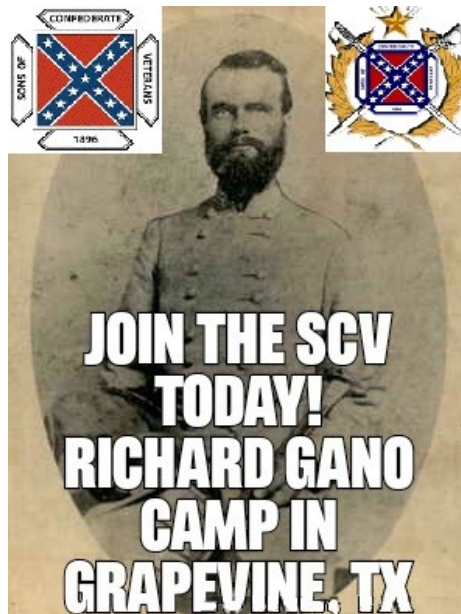

Chaplin's Corner - Excerpts from the Book of Ecclesiastes

On the tomb of Sir Christopher Wren in St. Paul's Cathedral in London, which he designed, are these words, "If you would see his monument, look around you." An architect friend of mine from A&M told me that when we design buildings, we want them to be safe, functional, and beautiful. Designing and building things is just one of the ways they can leave behind a legacy of what they have achieved when they are no longer living. Many of history's greatest architects are remembered for a few centuries primarily for the structures they designed and built. But as time passes, we forget their names. Who designed the Great Pyramids of Egypt, The Parthenon in Greece, the Coliseum in Rome, Notre Dame in Paris, the Eiffel Tower, the Statue of Liberty, Mount Rushmore, and Stone Mountain (Guston Borglum designed and built both)? Buildings, bridges, monuments, and stadiums do not last forever. With the passing of time they eventually fall into a state of disrepair due to natural forces, fire, vandalism and must be demolished, repaired, and/or replaced. The monuments that are enduring are not built with mortar and stone. Rather, they are built with Christ-like deeds of love and kindness which must be erected in human hearts. The ravages of time crumble into dust and the metal dissolves from rust these monuments of stone, iron, brick, and wood. Deeds that are motivated by the constraining love of Christ for individuals or for all mankind — will endure. To illustrate how this is true, I challenge you to spend a few moments in reflection to participate in an especially important mental exercise: 1. Name the five wealthiest people in the world. 2. Name the last five Heisman trophy winners. 3. Name ten people who have won the Nobel and the Pulitzer Prize. 4. Name the last half dozen Academy Award winners for best actor and actress. 5. Name the last decade's worth of winners in the World Series. 6. Name the most valuable player in the last five NCAA men's basketball championships. Perhaps you can name some of these, but it would likely be only a few. We do not remember awfully long who the headliners of yesterday were. On this list there are no second-rate achievers. They are the best in their respective fields. But the applause dies. Awards tarnish with the passing of time. Achievements are forgotten. Accolades and certificates are buried with their owners. They become yesterday's news. Now let us continue with our mental exercise: 1. List the names of a few teachers who aided your journey through school. 2. Name three friends who stood by your side during a difficult time. 3. Name five people who have touched your life in a special way. 4. Name five people who have qualities you greatly admire. 5. Name five people who have made you feel appreciated and special. 6. Name five people, not including the members of your family, with whom you enjoy spending time. The second list was easier than the first, wasn't it? This is true because the people who make a difference in our lives are not the ones with the most credentials...or have the most money...or have the most college or graduate school degrees...or were given the most awards. Rather, they are the persons who care the most, the ones who value others and seek to serve them. If you have followed the instructions in the mental exercise suggested above, you have reinforced for you and important truth: Things in our world that are often regarded as the most important are not, after all, all that important. Having recognized those who have touched our lives in special ways demands that we give serious thought to the persons we know who need our care. How well do we know each member of the R.M. Gano Camp? I mean really know them. Our meetings, reunions and get togethers are few and far between these days, but that should not stop us from picking up the phone and just checking on each other. Remember that each one of us shares a commonality, of having our ancestors fighting for the Confederacy in the War Between the States. And with that said each one of us has a story to tell and share with each other. It should be our goal to live our lives in such a way that those we will one day leave behind remember and appreciate what we have done to enrich their lives. If we accomplish that, we will not have lived in vain. Ecclesiastes 1-12

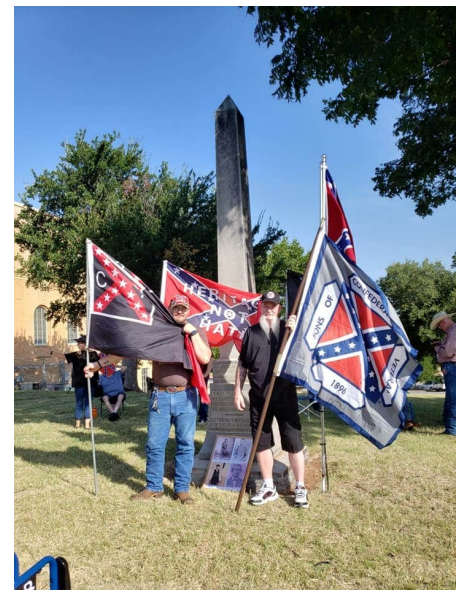

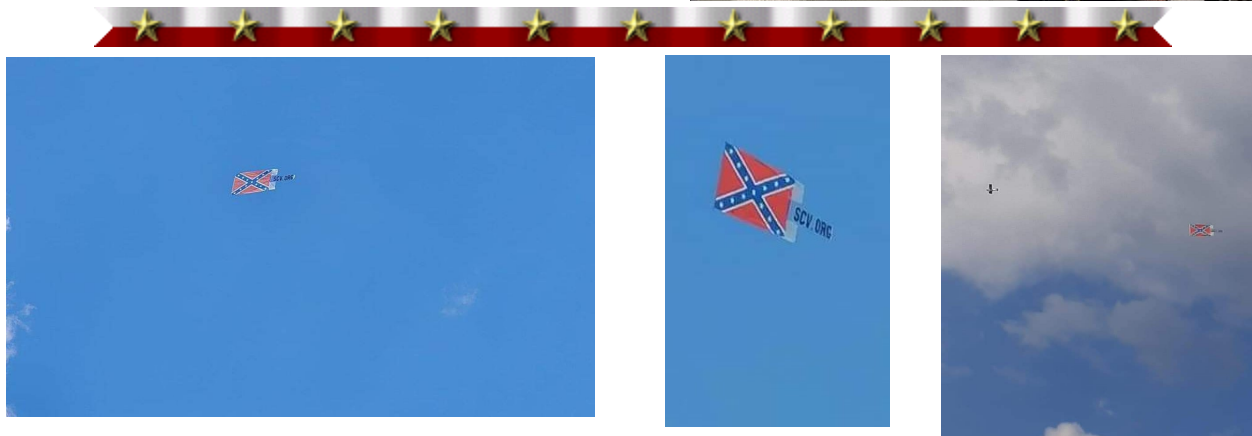

The destruction of the “Grandest Avenue in the South” has begun. On 01 JUL 1776 Continental Congress delegate John Dickinson said: "we ought to brave the storm in a skiff made of paper."

Today we have done just that. All our labor, hope & dreams have been poured into a Writ of Certiorari to the Supreme Court of the United States, asking that the Court recognize heritage groups as having standing to sue to defend threatened monuments AND that the class of persons with standing be broadened to allow someone to be able to fight to protect monuments in court. Our client and Appellant, Steve Littlefield, representing the remaining family of University of Texas benefactor, Major George Washington Littlefield, recently died and we reached out to his family to act to keep his claim alive. This they refused to do, despite a personal appeal from Chief Trial Counsel Lyons.

No matter - we point out to the Court that standing should be broadened so that a claim is not extinguished when a claimant dies and his remaining family refuses to take up his cause.

The dragon we have to slay is the so-called "government speech" doctrine imposed by the Court in 2015 - but to contest we must first the Court must rule that we have standing, we must be allowed in the court, with the right to argue against "government speech" on behalf of the Heritage community! If not them, then who?

The Heritage community sees this as a critically important national issue needing redress - hopefully the Court will agree. If the Court grants our Writ - the battle is on! We must enlist the country behind us as we seek to persuade the Supremes on the justness of our cause.

We need you in the Heritage community to share this newsletter as well as your own letters & commentary with your friends, families, elected officials and your local media!

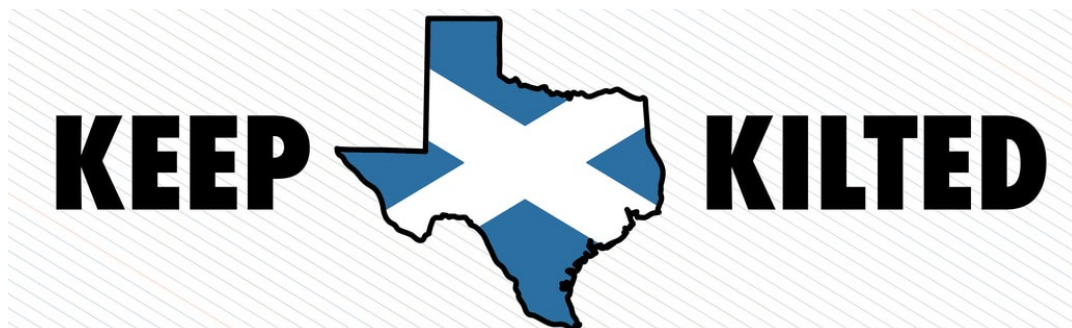
