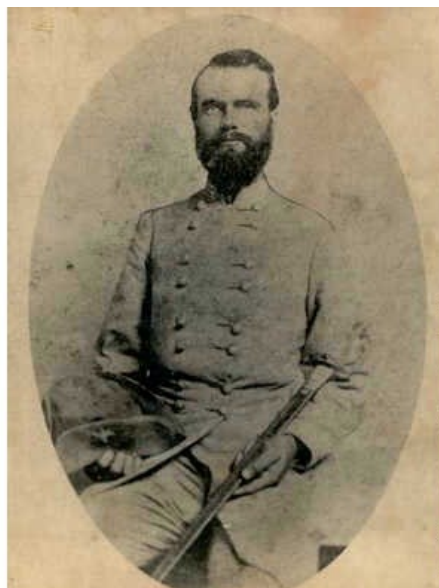
1st Lt Commanders Report

Chaplain's Corner

Isaiah 45: 1-8

Thus says the LORD to his anointed, to Cyrus, whose right hand I grasped, to subdue nations before him and to loose the belts of kings, to open doors before him that gates may not be closed; "I will go before you and level the exalted places, I will break in pieces the doors of bronze and cut through the bars of iron, I will give you the treasures of darkness and the hoards in secret places, that you may know that it is I, the LORD, the God of Israel, who call you by your name, I name you, though you do not know me.

"I am the LORD, and there is no other, besides me there is no God; I equip you, though you do not know me, that people may know, from the rising of the sun and from the west, that there is none besides me; I am the LORD, and there is no other. I form light and create darkness; I make well-being and create calamity; I am the LORD, who does all these things.

"Shower, O heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain down righteousness; let the earth open, that salvation and righteousness may bear fruit; let the earth cause them both to sprout; I the LORD have created it."

How do you react when you read something such as Isaiah 45:2, which says that God will knock down mountains and cut through prison bars for you? John Eldridge writes what some of us think:

Doesn't the language of the Bible sometimes sound...overblown? Really now—God is going to level mountains for us? We'd be happy if he just helped us get through the week. What's all that about breaking down gates of bronze and cutting through bars of iron? I mean, it sounds heroic, but, well, who's really in need of that? This isn't ancient Samaria. We'd settle for a parking place at the mall.

The Bible's language is not overblown. Eldridge continues if we recognize that we have an enemy:

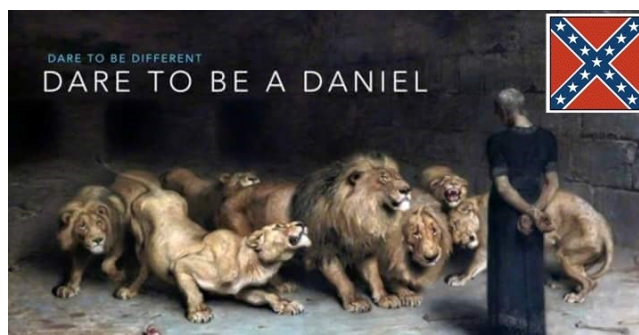
You were born into a world at war. When Satan lost the battle against Michael and his angels. "he was hurled to the earth, and his angels with him" (Rev. 12:9). That means that right now, on this earth, there are hundreds of thousands, if not millions, of fallen angels, foul spirits, bent on our destruction...So what does (Satan) spend every day and every night of his sleepless, untiring existence doing? "Then the dragon was enraged at the woman and went off to make war against...those who obey God's commandments and hold to the testimony of Jesus" (v.17). He has you in his crosshairs, and he isn't smiling.

We have an enemy. But we also have a savior. God sent Jesus to level mountains, knock down doors, cut through iron bars—do whatever is needed to free us from the power of the enemy. The one who was sinless bore the penalty for our sins on the cross, then conquered death by rising from the dead. It is a whole lot better than a parking place at the mall.

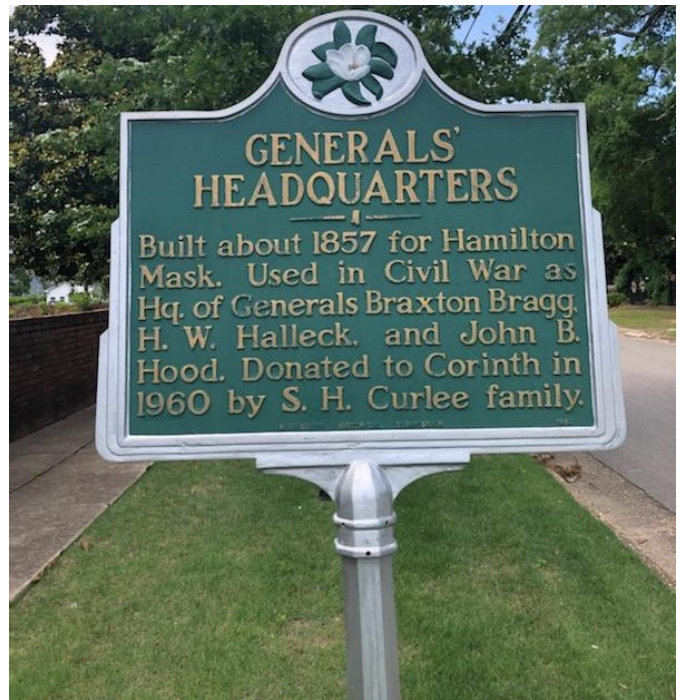

God has not let us down - ever, but it is hard not to worry about the immediate future - especially when the coffers are empty and there is so much to be done yet.

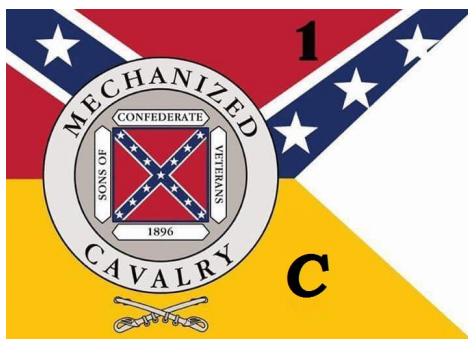

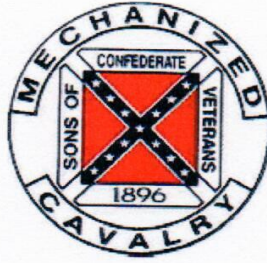
