
Greetings members and friends,

Chaplaín's Corner "You Can Depend on Me"

"Be to me a rock of refuge, to which I may continually come; you have given the command to save me, for you are my rock and fortress." Psalm 71:3

One of the most popular fil genres of all time is the western. Westerns became popular because Americans romanticized the frontier spirit of the Old West, where people succeeded because of arduous work, determination, rugged independence, and self-reliance.

The icon of the western was Marion Morrison, better known as John Wayne. He appeared in 142 films, most of them westerns and some of them directed by John Ford. Wayne was a top box office draw for three decades. Wayne's hit films included *Stagecoach, Red River, The Alamo, The Longest Day, True Grit, The Cowboys,* and his last film *The Shootist.* Critics have stated that Wayne's best performance was in John Ford's movie *The Searchers* and in my opinion, this is Wayne's best performance.

In *The Searchers* we are introduced to Wayne's character, Ethan Edwards as he appears at his brother's home in southern Texas wearing his "Johnny Reb coat" some three years after The War Between the States. Later in the film the Reverend Clayton (Ward Bond) wants to deputize Ethan into the Texas Rangers, Ethan replies: "A man is only good for one oath at a time. I took mine to the Confederate States of America."

Here are some famous lines uttered by Wayne in films:

"Well, there are some things a man just can't run away from."

- "" Sorry don't get it done, Dude."
- "Well, son, since you haven't learned to respect your elders, it's time you learned to respect your betters."

In the films of John Wayne, dependence is a sign of weakness. In the world of David dependence was a necessity.

David was the king of Israel. During his forty-year reign, he ruled over a united kingdom, led them to victory in many battles, expanded the area of the kingdom, and paved the way for his son, Solomon, to build the Temple. David recognized; however, that his successes in life were blessings from God. He owed his accomplishments, his position, his possessions, and his very life to God.

In Psalm 71, David admits that he needs God, every day. He prays that he can depend on God continually, as he has done throughout his life. 
And our most important outreach, the 80 million disenfranchised voters from the last "election."


