Did you ever wonder how the trails got their names?

Grouse Mountain.--The old timers named the highest point (9,843 ft.) in the Park for the presence of the stealthy Spruce Grouse. These fat little cousins of the Prairie Chickens were the masters of patience. Sitting still in the shade of a shrub, they would move only if you were to step right on them---then, in an explosive blast of wingbeat and feathers, they'd take to the trees. If the shotgun toting homesteader recovered quick enough, there'd be good eatin' that night.
