Thurs, Aug. 14: Sketch Hike

8:30-10 a.m. Meet at Grouse Mountain Trailhead

Explore a 2 mile moderate loop to the highest point in the park at 9,851 feet. We will stop to sketch some of the park's natural beauty guided by local artist Cyndi Deswik. No experience needed, just your zest for learning! Art supplies are provided, but you may bring your own if you desire.

Fri, Aug. 15: Fly Fishing Basics Plus 9 a.m.-1 p.m. Meet at the Visitor Center

Enhance your fly fishing knowledge in this fly fishing plus class which will include a three hour classroom portion. Go more in depth on techniques and equipment. This class is best for those who have some experience fly fishing or have attended a Mueller fly fishing basics class. It is suggested that you bring your own rod to continue to hone your skills on the equipment you will use outside of the class.
