Saturday, February 1st

Hike: Preacher's Hollow and Stoner Mill Trail

9:15 am Meet at Preacher's Hollow Trailhead
Watch for tracks and signs of the animals that live in Mueller State Park as you hike Preacher's Hollow with Naturalist Nancy. 2.5-mile moderate trail.

Sunday, February 2nd

Hike: Red Tail Overlook and Lost Pond

9:30 am Meet at the Visitor Center
Visit a beautiful view from the Red Tail Overlook then hike down to Lost Pond and trail 1 to complete the 2.5-mile loop. Led by Naturalist Rose.

Saturday, February 8th

Flying Wild – Teacher Workshop

Hike: Outlook Ridge Trail

9:00 am Meet at Outlook Ridge Trailhead
Join Naturalist Penny on this popular trail following the ridge to overlooks with views to the south and west. 2-3-mile moderate trail.

Hike: Homestead and Black Bear Trails

9:30 am Meet at Homestead Trailhead
Take a pleasant 2-mile hike through forest, meadows, and rock formations with Naturalist Rose.

Snowshoe Hike 2

11:00 am Meet at Elk Meadow parking lot
Do you want to put some more miles on your snowshoes? Join Naturalist Felicia Mendygral for this snowshoe hike. We'll start with a quick warm up then get on the trail. When we take a break, we will discuss snow traps. This is the second snowshoe hike in the series of three snowshoes hikes where the distance will increase with each hike. 3.5-miles. Don't forget to bring water, power snack and a lunch. If you still have energy after the snowshoe, Mueller is a great place to sled.

Saturday, February 15th

Hike: Outlook Ridge Trail

9:15 am Meet at Outlook Ridge Trailhead
Join Naturalist Nancy on this popular trail to an overlook to the south and west. Then hike down to Lost Pond then Revenuers Ridge to return. 3.5-mile moderate trail.

Sunday, February 16th

Hike: Rock Pond

9:30 am Meet at the Visitor Center
Join Naturalist Rose on a 5-mile hike or snowshoe on a favorite trail deep in the backcountry to Rock Pond. Bring water, snacks and dress in layers!

Sunday, February 23rd

Hike: School Pond Trail

9:30 am Meet at Preacher's Hollow Trailhead
Take a pleasant 2.5-mile hike through the winter woods with Naturalist Rose.

Saturday, February 29th

Hike: Elk Meadow Trail

9:00 am Meet at the Elk Meadow Trailhead
Join Naturalist Penny on this 2.5-mile hike on a favorite trail with great views of Pikes Peak.
