Sunday, July 6: Mining History of Colorado Talk 2-3:30 p.m. Meet at the Visitor Center

The 1858 discovery of Gold in the Denver area led to a mass migration to Colorado and the beginning of the mining industry that is still active today. Join us as we discuss the gold industry that led to Colorado statehood.

Sunday, July 6: Campfire Storytime 7-8 p.m. Meet at the Amphitheater
