If you go downtown and look at the corner of South Eucalyptus and Commerce, you will see some differences due to the site work accomplished to this point by our good friend and supporter Buddy Hopson. You'll see some photos later in the newsletter that make my point. Construction guru extraordinaire Don Laycock continues to work the details of how the site lays out down to the inch. Don is also a surveyor and had his gizmo in action to measure the specifics of the site. It was a thing to behold. As he did that work, he was assisted by Bobby Border—our Eagle Scout candidate. Bobby will be responsible for the sign at the corner. We are grateful for his participation.

The final details of the blueprints for the Visitors Center are being hammered out by local draftsman Don Polston, owner of Sunset Drafting. Don is an Army veteran and is doing all the work for free—another important "in-kind" contribution. His talents are amazing, and we are glad to have his support. There are many details to how everything on the site lays out in addition to the floorplan for the building. Even the structure of the sign is significant. Don's good friend, James Lange, is doing the structural plans for the sign. Thanks to James for his in-kind contribution.

Don and I met with Mart Prost of the North American Fence Contractors Association (NAFCA). Are these guys great! Short story: they are going to do the entire fence for the site for FREE. This would be a \$50K job if we had to pay for it. This major in-kind pledge will make a big impact in our funding for the project. We still need money, but we are elated with this pledge. Thanks to Mart and NAFCA. Finally, we met with Century Link who are going to remove the utility markers on the corner that would block the sign. Hooray!

The Three Versions of the Medal of Honor





Hero of the Month

Alexander Ramsey Nininger, Jr.

2nd Lieutenant, U.S. Army Fort Lauderdale, FL



Citation:

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity above and beyond the call of duty in action with the enemy near Abucay, Bataan, Philippine Islands, on 12 January 1942. This officer, though assigned to another company not then engaged in combat, voluntarily attached himself to Company K, same regiment, while that unit was being attacked by enemy force superior in firepower. Enemy snipers in trees and foxholes had stopped a counterattack to regain part of position. In hand-to-hand fighting which followed, 2d Lt. Nininger repeatedly forced his way to and into the hostile position. Though exposed to heavy enemy fire, he continued to attack with rifle and handgrenades and succeeded in destroying several enemy groups in foxholes and enemy snipers. Although wounded 3 times, he continued his attacks until he was killed after pushing alone far within the enemy position. When his body was found after recapture of the position, 1 enemy officer and 2 enemy soldiers lay dead around him.
