April was a busy month on site. The pad for the memorial star was poured, as was the sign on the corner of Commerce and S. Eucalyptus. Work began on the form for the star, concrete block was installed for the stem walls of the visitors center. We also brought in fill dirt to bring the interior of the stem walls up to the level where we would pour the concrete that will be the floor and surface of the stage area. All this due to the work of our supporters such as Jahna, Nucor, TOMO, John Elder, Buddy Hopson, and many others. See the photos later for an idea of what I mean.

Of course, putting in the fill dirt meant compaction tests (all fantastic). Putting up block and pouring concrete meant permits and inspections (all good to go). In other news, and perhaps some of the most exciting news of all—the one living recipient of the Medal of Honor from the State of Florida, Mr. Robert R. I personally spoke to Mr. Ingram and he was very gracious in accepting our invitation and agreeing to our request.

This is such an exciting and important effort. Honoring the twenty-four real heroes and educating our fellow citizens, especially our youth, on the high cost of freedom is something we are proud of. Hero of the Month

Baldomero López


First Lieutenant, U.S. Marine Corps Tampa, FL



Citation

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty as a marine platoon commander of Company A, in action against enemy aggressor forces. With his platoon 1st Lt. Lopez was engaged in the reduction of immediate enemy beach defenses after landing with the assault waves. Exposing himself to hostile fire, he moved forward alongside a bunker and prepared to throw a hand grenade into the next pillbox whose fire was pinning down that sector of the beach. Taken under fire by an enemy automatic weapon and hit in the right shoulder and chest as he lifted his arm to throw, he fell backward and dropped the deadly missile. After a moment, he turned and dragged his body forward in an effort to retrieve the grenade and throw it. In critical condition from pain and loss of blood, and unable to grasp the hand grenade firmly enough to hurl it, he chose to sacrifice himself rather than endanger the lives of his men and, with a sweeping motion of his wounded right arm, cradled the grenade under him and absorbed the full impact of the explosion. His exceptional courage, fortitude, and devotion to duty reflect the highest credit upon 1st Lt. Lopez and the U.S. Naval Service. He gallantly gave his life for his country.

Honors and Legacy

Several structures have been named in López's honor, including a state nursing home and a school in Seffner, Florida. A Korean War memorial at the Ed Radice Sports Complex in Tampa was opened on November 11, 2007, and dedicated to Lopez. The memorial features a rock from the beach at Incheon. A public swimming pool across from Macfarlane Park in West Tampa is named for him. The U.S. Navy's Military Sealift Command named a container ship after him, the USNS *1st Lt. Baldomero Lopez* (T-AK-3010). In Bancroft Hall, the U.S. Naval Academy dormitory, a room is dedicated to him (Room No. 3021), with a display including his photo and a bronze plaque of his Medal of Honor citation. There is also the Baldomero Lopez State Veteran' nursing home in Land O'Lakes FL at 6919 Parkway Blvd.



There are three versions of the Medal of Honor. One for each of the three military departments: the Army, the Navy, and the Air Force. Army recipients get the Army version—no surprise there. The Navy version is for the Navy, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard. Finally, the Air Force version is for the Air Force and Space Force. To date, there is one Coast Guard recipient. Some day we are sure to have a Space Force recipient, but as it is only a few years old, there are none as of now. We will have three flagpoles around the memorial displaying these three emblems.
