## **Chairman's Message**

May was another busy month for us. Among other things, the stem walls were filled, the floor and stage were poured, the memorial star was filled and poured, as was the sidewalk around it. Concrete block was completed for the Visitors Center and more. This all involved the talented work of folks such as Red E Equipment, Sunbelt Rentals, Gadd & Associates, Jahna, Nucor, TOMO, Gettle & Associates, Heartland Exterminating, and more.

This work is a masterpiece of artistic choreography orchestrated by our construction master, Don Laycock. The coordination and integration of multiple commodity areas of work to and make sure we stay on track are all a thing of beauty. Of course, there are challenges along the way, but we will be successful.

We also continue to do the paperwork. Our latest report to the Florida Department of Education in Tallahassee was approved and they sent us the next iteration of funding - \$62.5K. It goes fast since the pace of construction has really picked up.

Seeing things go "vertical" is really gratifying. If you have been by of late to see our progress, I encourage you to do so. It is a sight to behold. The pictures you will see later in the newsletter will give you an idea of what I am talking about.

Soon, we will take delivery of the trusses, get them installed along with the roof, and then start "drying" in the interior, erecting the framing, and starting all the inside work. We believe we are on track to complete the work by early August, and will make our goal of holding the dedication ceremony on 11 September at

10:00 AM. Mark your calendars—you are invited!!



# **Hero of the Month**

# **Bruce Wayne Carter**

Private First Class, U.S. Marine Corps Jacksonville, FL



# **Citation**

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty while serving as grenadier with Company H in connection with combat operations against the enemy. Pfc. Carter's unit was maneuvering against the enemy during Operation Idaho Canyon and came under a heavy volume of fire from a numerically superior hostile force. The lead element soon became separated from the main body of the squad by a brush fire. Pfc. Carter and his fellow marines were pinned down by vicious crossfire when, with complete disregard for his safety, he stood in full view of the North Vietnamese Army soldiers to deliver a devastating volume of fire at their positions. The accuracy and aggressiveness of his attack caused several enemy casualties and forced the remainder of the soldiers to retreat from the immediate area. Shouting directions to the marines around him, Pfc. Carter then commenced leading them from the path of the rapidly approaching brush fire when he observed a hostile grenade land between him and his companions. Fully aware of the probable consequences of his action but determined to protect the men following him, he unhesitatingly threw himself over the grenade, absorbing the full effects of its detonation with his body. Pfc. Carter's indomitable courage, inspiring initiative, and selfless devotion to duty upheld the highest traditions of the Marine Corps and the U.S. Naval Service. He gallantly gave his life in the service of his country.
