#### Chairman's Message

It has been quite a busy month working on the details of the design with our friends at Marmer Construction, led by Marty Wohl. Willem Badenhorst and Krystal Ramsey are amazing folks—professional and diligent. They will get things moving within a couple of weeks and submit all plans to the City of Sebring so we can get our building permits and start construction. It is very exciting to say the least!

We can also announce that Graybar Electric is not only helping with the lighting design requirements, but they have also worked to donate all the lights that will go inside the Visitors Center. And they continue to work to be able to donate all cable, wiring, outlets, etc. This will represent a major cost savings to us.

I also want to give a shout out to Anderson Windows. They have given us the entire window package at half the retail price. Instead of \$33K we are getting the windows for \$18.6K, and they are giving us an additional \$3K donation. This is another huge savings for us.

Finally, our newest partner and supporter is Griffin's Carpet Mart of Sebring. They are going to provide all of the flooring for the Visitors Center along with the installation at no cost to us. WOW! Yet another huge savings. We met with Tom Griffin and his sister Kelly Griffin Cosgrave on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of August to discuss the many aspects of the interior of the building. Kelly is an interior decoration guru and will help our "decorating committee" with all those aspects. Again, this represents a substantial savings for us.

I have made presentations at the American Legion Post 25 in Lake Placid, and they are doing a fund-raiser for us. On the 6<sup>th</sup> of September, I will be speaking to the Avon Park Noon Rotary Club. They have expressed an interest in helping us and we sure can use it.

We are so grateful for the support and assistance from our partners, new and old. We would not be able to make this happen without that support. Thank you so much!!





Hero of the Month

## **Larry Eugene Smedley**

## Corporal, U.S. Marine Corps Orlando, FL



## Citation

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty while serving as a squad leader with Company D, in connection with operations against the enemy. On the evenings of 20 and 21 December 1967, Cpl. Smedley led his six-man squad

to an ambush site at the mouth of Happy Valley, near Phouc Ninh (2) in Quang Nam Province. Later that night an estimated 100 Viet Cong and North Vietnamese Army regulars, carrying 122-mm rocket launchers and mortars, were observed moving toward Hill 41. Realizing this was a significant enemy move to launch an attack on the vital Da Nang complex, Cpl. Smedley immediately took sound and courageous action to stop the enemy threat. After he radioed for a reaction force, he skillfully maneuvered his men to a more advantageous position and led an attack on the numerically superior enemy force. A heavy volume of fire from an enemy machine-gun positioned on the left flank of the squad inflicted several casualties on Cpl. Smedley's unit. Simultaneously, an enemy rifle grenade exploded nearby, wounding him in the right foot and knocking him to the ground. Cpl. Smedley disregarded this serious injury and valiantly struggled to his feet, shouting words of encouragement to his men. He fearlessly led a charge against the enemy machine-gun emplacement, firing his rifle and throwing grenades, until he was again struck by enemy fire and knocked to the ground. Gravely wounded and weak from loss of blood, he rose and commenced a one-man assault against the enemy position. Although his aggressive and singlehanded attack resulted in the destruction of the machine gun, he was struck in the chest by enemy fire and fell mortally wounded. Cpl. Smedley's inspiring and courageous actions, bold initiative, and selfless devotion to duty in the face of certain death were in keeping with the highest traditions of the Marine Corps and the U.S. Naval Service. He gallantly gave his life for his country
