**John 15:8 "This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples."

How can we apply this lesson to our life?

A. Fellowship with Jesus <u>requires</u> obedience.

I John 1:7 "I we walk in the light as He is in the light we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, His Son, purifies us from all sin."

John 8:12 "I am the light of the world."

B. Fellowship with Jesus is broken by sin and rebellion.

I John 1:6 "If we claim to have fellowship with Him yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth."

Hebrews 12:10 "Our fathers disciplined us for a little while, as they thought best; but God disciplines us for our good, that we may share in His holiness."

Hebrews 12:11 "No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace for those who are trained by it."

C. Fellowship with Jesus is <u>restored</u> by genuine repentance.

2 Samuel 12:13 "I have sinned against the LORD."

I John 1:9 "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness."

D. Fellowship with Jesus does not start until you have a personal <u>relationship</u> with Jesus!

Romans 10:13 "For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

John 3:36 "Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life, but whoever rejects the Son will not see life, for God's wrath remains on them."

"I AM the True Vine!" John 15:1-8 Lesson #8 5/4/25

Psalm 80:8 "You brought a vine out of Egypt; you drove out the nations and planted it."

Jeremiah 2:21 "I had planted you like a choice vine of sound and reliable stock. How then did you turn against me into a corrupt, wild vine?"

I. Jesus <u>delivered</u> a vineyard metaphor.

A. The vine <u>represents</u> Jesus.

**John 15:1a "I am the true vine,"

B. The gardener refers to the heavenly Father.

**John 15:1b "... and my Father is the gardener."

C. The branches <u>represent</u> believers.

John 15:5a "I am the vine; you are the branches."

II. Jesus <u>described</u> the duties of the vineyard gardener.

A. Some branches are cut off.

**John 15:2a "He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit,"

B. Other branches are carefully pruned.

**John 15:2b "... while every branch that does bear fruit, He prunes so that it will be even more fruitful."

Psalm 119:67 "Before I was afflicted, I went astray, but now, I obey your word."

Psalm 119:71 "It was good for me to be afflicted, so that I might learn your decrees."

John 15:3 "You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you."

John 13:1 "... And you are clean, though not everyone of you."

III. Jesus <u>defined</u> the responsibilities of His disciples.

- A. The disciples were to remain in Him.
- **John 15:4a "Remain in me, and I will remain in you."
 - B. The disciples couldn't produce fruit from their own resources.
- **John 15:4b "... No branch can bear fruit by itself; It must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me."
- IV. Jesus <u>detailed</u> the benefits of remaining in Him.
 - A. The disciple who remains in Jesus will bear <u>much</u> <u>fruit</u>.
- **John 15:5a "I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him he will bear much fruit;"
 - 1. Fruitfulness means we reveal the character of Christ.
- **Galatians 5:22** "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, [23] gentleness and self-control."
 - 2. Fruitfulness means we reflect the God-honoring conduct.
- *I Peter 1:15* "But just as He who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do. [16] For it is written, "Be holy, because I am holy."
 - 3. Fruitfulness means we will <u>contribute</u> to the needs of others.
- **2 Corinthians 8:1** "And now, brothers, we want you to know about the grace that God has given the Macedonian churches. ^[2] Out of the most severe trial, their overflowing joy and their extreme poverty welled up in rich generosity."
- **2 Corinthians 8:4** "They urgently pleaded with us for the privilege of sharing in this service to the saints."
 - 4. Fruitfulness means we express Christlike communication.

Hebrews 13:15 "Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise – the fruit of lips that confess His name."

5. Fruitfulness means we share <u>Christ</u> with non-believers.

Mark 16:15 "And He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature."

B. The disciple who remains in Jesus will <u>not be fruitless</u>.

**John 15:5b "... apart from me you can do nothing."

**John 15:6 "If anyone does not remain in me, he is like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned."

John 10:27 "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. ²⁸ I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one will snatch them out of my hand."

Ephesians 1:13 "And you also were included in Christ when you heard the message of truth, the gospel of your salvation. When you believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit."

Ephesians 1:14 "Who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession—to the praise of his glory.

Romans 4:7 "Blessed are they whose transgressions are forgiven, who sins are covered. [8] Blessed is the man whose sin the Lord will never count against him."

Romans 8:1 "Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus."

C. The disciple who remains in Jesus will pray with force.

**John 15:7 "If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will given you."

I John 5:14 "This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us."

James 5:16b "... The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective."

D. The disciple who remains in Jesus will glorify the Heavenly <u>Father</u>.
