In a similar situation only a few days later, two Fox News Journalists, Pierre Zakrzewski and Oleksandra Kuvshynova, were in a vehicle that was under fire resulting in their deaths.


cartridge containing hashish oil was found in her carry-on at Moscow's Sheremetyevo Airport.
