

A Climate of Injustice, Wisconsin is not Immune

Prof. Emerita Margarita Alario, Environmental Sociologist, UW-Whitewater

While rich countries plus China contribute two third (2/3) of annual carbon emissions, the entire continent of Africa emits three percent (3%). And while nations and communities, such as indigenous people of Wisconsin and the Americas, contributed the least to the anthropogenic global warming (AGW), they are the most affected by it. This is what may be described as a global climate of injustice. Welcome to the Anthropocene where humans'-built systems are the meteorites that led to the dinosaurs' extinction.
