OUR FAITH COMMUNITY

From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We are in the second week after Christmas celebrating the Epiphany. The first reading depicts Jerusalem as the divine place where God's temple on earth could be found as a beacon of light amidst darkness. God restores His dwelling among His people. The Lord is a light that clarifies right paths to His people and foreign nations, enabling them to navigate life's obstacles and hardships as though walking on a path at midday. This is a sign of blessing, vision and prosperity to God's people.

The second reading explores the idea of revelation as a distinct form of knowledge or enlightenment. Earlier God's revelation was understood as discerning the divine plan using human reason. Now while reason continues revelation refers to a special way and direct knowledge of God and His plan as a gift

from the Spirit. Hence, it is the grace of God which is an unmerited, unparalleled, unmediated free gift from God.

The Gospel narrates the story of the three educated men (magi in Greek) from the East visiting Judea after discerning the birth of the child Jesus. They paid Him homage as the newborn king of the Jews, with the movement of a star signaling His birth and place. The child's birth is advertly announced as a threat to Herod's royal throne. As Herod plays his political game, the visitors find their way to Bethlehem, pay their homage to the child with His mother Mary and return to their homes. How does Jesus manifest Himself to us in our daily lives?

Epiphany blessings to all, and Happy New Year! My best memories of this feast are from our former high school Teen Choir's Epiphany party each year; we had an annual tradition of each student sharing examples from the past year when Christ had become manifest in their lives, such as when they discovered a new friendship in a way that they had never thought possible. They enjoyed this and said it made them more aware, throughout the year, of what "epiphany moments" they could share at our annual party. 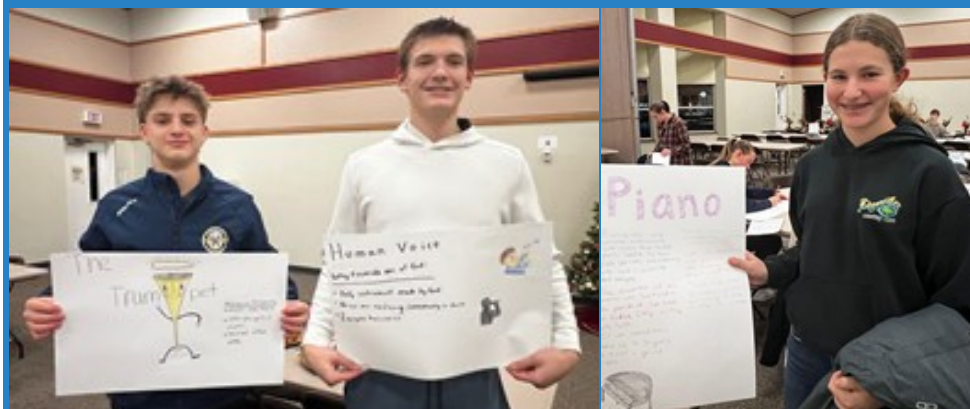

From the Parish Nurse

Sight is one of our most treasured senses, so good eye care is very important. Especially in our children where conjunctivitis (pink eye) is a frequent occurrence. Conjunctivitis can be caused by a virus or a bacterial infection. Symptoms include a scratchy, foreign body sensation (likened to sand). The eye will appear reddened and often have a yellow discharge causing the eye to be crusted shut (especially in the morning).

Prevent the spread of the infection to the other eye by: good handwashing before and after working on the infected eye; do not touch or rub your eyes; and use clean towels and washcloths to cleanse the face and do not share these with anyone. Treatment depends on the cause of the inflammation and may include an ointment, eye drops or oral medication. Contact your healthcare provider for assessment and treatment. If pain develops or vision deteriorates call your physician or go to the emergency department or walk-in immediately.

Installing eye drops or ointment:

- * wash hands well
- * sit or stand in front of a mirror
- * with the forefinger gently pull the lower lid down until a pocket-like area forms
- * release a drop of medication or ¼ inch of ointment directly on the center area (take care not to touch the eye with the dropper)
- * blink your eye to distribute the medication
- * blot any excess solution with a clean tissue (do not rub the eye)

Take care and get out on sunny days to get Vitamin D and help fight the 'winter blues.' Just remember to wear sunglasses as you can sunburn your eyes in winter as the snow increases the reflection of the sun and so increases the possibility of burning the eyes. God bless! ~ Ann Jelinek RN, PN
