

From the Pastor

<u>Theological Virtues: Hope – 1/3</u>

Hope: Hope means a feeling of expectation and certainty for a certain thing to happen. It means trusting. When we hope, we are not passive, but active. Hope is an essential virtue of Christian life. It is a confident affirmation that God is faithful, that He will complete what He has begun. It is a hope of certainty. It is a Christian strength. **"In silence and in hope shall your strength be"** (*Is 30:15*). Where there is no hope there is no future and life. Where there is no hope, there is no faith.

Our Blessed Mother Mary was silent, and did not try to justify herself in Joseph's eyes; she was silent because she was filled with hope in God and absolutely certain of His help. God will never disappoint us if we hope in Him. Just as He sent an angel to Joseph to reveal the mystery of Mary's matrimony, He will always find a way to help and sustain a soul who entrusts itself wholly to Him.

Eucharist is our hope both for this life and for the life to come. It sustains us in adversity, fortifies us in the struggles, saves us for eternal life, and brings us to heaven by providing us with the food necessary for



our journey. This is the Christian virtue of hope that makes us alive to our faith in Christ and helps us to continue our spiritual journey. Without this hope there is no journey.

Today's first reading is so joyful, when Jesus announces that, through his presence, the prophecies were fulfilled of glad tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, and freedom for the oppressed. It's easy for us to wish for things we've missed because of the pandemic, but the people to whom Ezra spoke hadn't been able to gather for worship in over fifty years! As we are blessed by God's love for us, we don't have the luxury of just passively enjoying the love, but are called to spread it by making life easier for others—in other words, by service. In these quiet weeks of winter, between Christmas and Lent, can we spend some time thinking of how we could serve our parish by volunteering in a ministry? The Synod process, initiated by Pope Francis, will give us ongoing opportunities to explore what it means to "be community".



Bishop Jim Powers recently wrote an updated letter to all of the parishioners of our diocese regarding COVID. Copies will also be available on the Scrip table in back of church after Mass or at the parish office during office hours (Monday-Friday from 8:00AM-3:30PM).

Bishop Powers also released a letter to parish staff announcing the diocesan plans for participation in the **Synod on Synodality** called by Pope Francis this past fall. Our first phase consisted of saying the prayer for the Synod. We will begin the next phase of our participation in the coming months. It will require that we gather together to discern the movement and guidance of the Holy Spirit. Our parish cluster will be holding sessions for this in the coming weeks. Please watch for more information in our bulletin and Facebook page as it becomes available. If you are unable to attend one of these scheduled sessions in person, the diocese will have an online portal for anyone that would like to participate virtually and this will be open during the same time frame as our parish sessions.

From the Parish Nurse

In Case of Emergency! These signs are everywhere such as:

In Case of Emergency – 'Break Glass'; In Case of Emergency – 'Call 911'; and so on. The presence and use of cell phones has made contacting someone easier. We all carry names and numbers stored in the memory of our cell phones, but nobody, other than ourselves know which of these numbers belong to our closest family and friends.



If we were involved in an accident or taken ill, the people attending to us may have our cell phone but wouldn't know who to call. Yes, there are hundreds of numbers but who do we call if you are unable to tell us?

The "ICE (In Case of Emergency)" campaign has the answer. It is a method of contacting someone during emergency situations. All you need to do is to store the number of a contact person or persons who should be contacted during an emergency under the name "ICE".

The idea was thought up by a paramedic who found that when he went to the scene of an accident, there was always a cell phone with the patient, but he did not know what number to call. He therefore thought that it would be a good idea if there was a nationally recognized name for this purpose. In an emergency situation, emergency service personnel and hospital staff would be able to quickly contact the right person by simply dialing "ICE". For more than one contact name simply enter ICE1, ICE2 and ICE3. It's a great idea that can make a difference. It really could save your life and put a loved one's mind at ease. ICE will speak for you when you are unable to.

Pass this idea on to all those close to you. You never know when it may be needed. Accidents and illnesses happen anywhere and everywhere, and this one step can make all the difference.


