OUR FAITH COMMUNITY

From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We are in the fourth week in ordinary time, year A. The first reading tells us the 'Day of the Lord' will come suddenly without any warning, bringing divine justice. This will result in the transformation of society, culture and the lives of the people. Such a life is characterized by simplicity, humility, honesty, peace and meaningful relationship with the Lord. Is our goal such a humble and upright life? What do we do to transform ourselves?

The second reading is a warning to those who are prideful. This passage also calls us to seek humility. Embracing the gospel means seeking lowliness and humility and not honor or status. The power of the gospel is to be found not in Christ's mighty deeds – great as they are- but in His cross.

God chose 'nobodies' to demonstrate that their accomplishments were divinely wrought. Our achievements are to be attributed and boasted in the Lord with humility and gratitude.

The gospel presents to us the sermon on the mount about the Beatitudes. Our Lord enumerates a series of fundamental principles or attitudes that bring forth blessedness and a good life, emphasizing the role of littleness. Spiritual poverty and meekness are traits that characterize a blessed life. Blessedness is not contained in an elevated status, but rather in choosing to be little and striving to bring forth that which is good for others. What are the ways that we choose and strive to live a life of blessedness?

Liturgy & Music Notes from Jan

Youth Choir—Our next practice will be held this Wednesday, February 4.

The next **small group discussion with Dick Huseby** will be held on Monday, February 16 at 10AM in the CCC.

Our **“Teaching Mass”** will take place next Sunday, February 8 at 9:30AM. This special Family Mass will have a focus of learning more about the prayers and beautiful rituals and symbols of the Mass. Special worship aids will be provided, and Deacon Dave will assist Fr. Aloysius in the teaching. There is always something for us to learn, especially when we’ve been doing the same thing for a long time without deeply understanding what or why.

Last year’s blessed palms can be brought to the church, beginning this week. They will be burned in time for Ash Wednesday Masses on February 18.

As Catholics, sometimes we are torn to find the words to pray for peace—to seek beyond our politics to live a culture of respect for all of human life and all people. In these very challenging times, Archbishop Paul S. Coakley, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, echoed Pope Leo’s words with the following reminder:

“Today, Pope Leo XIV reminds us that ‘the Gospel must be proclaimed and lived in every setting, serving as a leaven of fraternity and peace among all individuals, cultures, religions and peoples.’

“It is with this in mind that I prayerfully urge calm, restraint, and respect for human life in Minneapolis, and all those places where peace is threatened. Public authorities especially have a responsibility to safeguard the well-being of people in service to the common good.

“As a nation we must come together in dialogue, turning away from dehumanizing rhetoric and acts which threaten human life. In this spirit, in unity with Pope Leo, it is important to proclaim, ‘Peace is built on respect for people!’”

Follow-up to the recent parish training session addressing potential threats to church safety:

“The ushers, staff, etc. recently met with members of the Sheriff’s Office to discuss potential threat incidents and the parish’s response to those threats. It was reiterated to us that the best thing we can do is not to live in fear, but rather to stay vigilant. Engage with others, have conversations, and

be neighborly...not only is this directly in line with what Jesus teaches us to do but if something isn’t right, it will be your first opportunity to know that something isn’t right. In other words...if you are familiar with the ordinary, it’ll be easier to spot the unordinary. Along with that... if you see something, say something. The ushers, the staff, the council...we’ve all been instructed on how to properly respond to active and potential threats.”

From the Parish Nurse

February 2 is Give Kids a Smile Awareness Day to ensure access to quality oral healthcare for ALL children. Why Give Kids A Smile? According to the Center for Disease Control, cavities are one of the most common chronic diseases of childhood in the United States. Untreated cavities can cause pain and infections that may lead to problems with eating, speaking, playing, and learning. Children who have poor oral health

often miss more school and receive lower grades than children who don't. More than half of children aged 6-8 have had a cavity in at least one of their baby (primary) teeth. More than half of adolescents aged 12-19 have had a cavity in at least one of their permanent teeth. Children aged 5-19 years of age from low-income families are twice as likely (25%) to have cavities, compared with children from higher-income households (11%). That's why the objectives of Give Kids A Smile are so important: 1) To provide care, find dental homes for as many underserved children as possible, and because every American deserves access to oral healthcare; 2) To raise awareness among the public and policymakers that access to dental care is a serious problem for many in the country, and no amount of charity care can solve the problem. Tiny Smiles, an ADA Foundation Give Kids A Smile program, provides free resources to help raise awareness about the oral health needs of children ages 0 (birth) to 5. The main objective is to increase the number of dentists comfortable with and willing to provide oral health services to children by age 1. For more information visit www.ADAFoundation.org/GKAS.

February 2 is also 'Go Red for Women Day and Rheumatoid Awareness Day (more on these later).
