OUR FAITH COMMUNITY

From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We have begun Lent since Ash Wednesday. As we know, Lent is the time to turn away from sin and turn back to God. The readings explore the origins of sin and death and contrast the power of sin with the mightier power of obedience to God. The first book of the Bible, Genesis, attributes the fullness of power and creation to God alone. Equally striking is Israel's teaching that the source of evil is not some primordial force, but rather that evil flows from the moral decisions of human beings. When the first parents made decisions for themselves apart from God's command, that caused them to sin. How do we choose in life?

The second reading provides many rhetorical arguments, comparing and contrasting between Adam and Christ, denoting that all are under the reign of sin and death and need salvation through Jesus Christ. Adam's disobedience to God's command

was responsible for the entrance of sin and death into the human condition. Whereas the obedience of Jesus brings acquittal, an abundance of grace, the gift of justification and life. What is our stand to overcome and turn away from sin, to obey or disobey the divine?

In the Gospel we hear that Jesus was led into the wilderness, after His baptism, to be tested. In all the three tests and the dialogues between the tempter and Jesus, our Lord reveals His true identity as the Son of God and passes the tests of obedience. His obedience demonstrated His faithful trust in God's providence. Hence sin is nothing but anything that undermines such obedience to God and His commands. During this Lent do we wish to work at least to some extent on how we could deal with sin by obeying God?



Liturgy & Music Notes from Jan Marked with ashes, Lent has begun, and as we travel the holy highway toward Easter, we again resolve to get closer to God. How that happens will be different for each of us. The parish calendar is filled with many opportunities for penance, for personal and public prayer, and reflection. Can we consider the concept of “giving more” instead of “giving up”? Perhaps there is a ministry of service that we could try. Lent is a season of great conversion, and a time of freedom from old habits that aren’t healthy for us. As we discussed at our recent small group sharing, “If the Lord woke you up today, He still has a purpose for you.”

The Parish Choir will sing the 9:30AM Mass on Sunday, March 8.

Youth Choir – The next rehearsal will be held on Wednesday, March 4 at the usual time.

Choir reminder—rehearsal for Holy Week/Triduum liturgies will be held today, **February 22** immediately after the 9:30AM Mass, lasting until Noon. All singers of all choirs are encouraged and welcome to sing the Holy Week liturgies—the most powerful liturgies of our Faith. Thank You!
