OUR FAITH COMMUNITY

From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We are in the fourth Sunday of Lent, Year A. The first reading tells us about the anointing of David as the King of Israel by the prophet Samuel. While King Saul was still in the office, God chose David to be anointed as King. Samuel was told by God that man sees the appearance, but the Lord looks into the heart. How important it is for us to reflect on these words and to become aware of the sacredness and purity of our inner self. Do the Lenten observances motivate us in the way the Lord perceives us?

The second reading is drawn from a larger ethical exhortation that distinguishes believers from non-believers. The separation between the two groups is expressed in the language using light and darkness. Before becoming the believers they lived in darkness and operated in secret. As believers they are the children

of light producing every kind of goodness, righteousness and truth. Let us reflect during this Lent whether we try to put away works of darkness and to live the life of the children of light.

In the gospel we hear about the miracle of a man born blind obtaining sight by the Lord. St. John in his gospel skillfully employs such significant encounters to deepen the faith of those who believe and to spark faith in those who seek insight. The reason this man was born blind was not the result of some sin, but to direct others by the Lord to God's glory. The man born blind moves from blindness to physical sight and to spiritual insight into Jesus's identity. Whereas the Pharisees move the opposite direction. All this unfolds amid rich symbolism. Which way do we move? Does Lent help us to obtain spiritual insights?

From the Parish Nurse

The main cause of multiple sclerosis is still unknown despite many theories: allergies, physical trauma, genetic,



environmental, or viral infections. Symptoms occur over time: fatigue, numbness, poor balance and coordination, weakness in muscles, vision changes, mood changes, and/or slurred speech. MS is more common in women than men; not directly inherited, yet genetics play an important role in who gets the disease; most frequently diagnosed between the ages of 20 and 50; can appear in young children, teens and older adults; and more common at northern latitudes and in Caucasians of northern European ancestry.

Finalizing the diagnosis may take several specialists and a battery of tests including tests for balance, muscle strength and coordination, an MRI, and eye exams. Treatment involves a 'whole' team of specialists, a family doctor, a neurologist, a physical and occupational therapist, as well as your family and a support group. Anxiety and depression are all emotions a person with MS encounters. Participation in a support group provides a connection with other MS sufferers. The National MS Society (www.nationalmssociety.org) and the Wisconsin Chapter (www.nationalmssociety.org/wig/home) websites can provide information and connection to a support group. Be alert to your own body, have regular physicals, and contact your healthcare provider if you have questions.


