From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We are on Easter Sunday. The Easter Vigil has seven readings from the OT. The *first* is the creation story, *second* is Abraham asked to sacrifice his son Isaac where his faith is being tested, *third* is the crossing of the Red sea, *fourth* is about the assurance of enduring love and mercy of God to His people, *fifth* is renewing the everlasting covenant, *sixth* is to hear, learn and obey the commandments of life, and *seventh* is about the transformation of life being purified and obtaining a new heart and a new spirit.

The *eighth* reading is from the epistle in the NT. It explains and encourages the hope of the baptized in the present age, obviously focusing on Christian behavior. It also draws our attention to the newness of life which Christ accomplished and stands as a model for us living for God. Our baptism into Christ Jesus is into death

and burial, resulting in newness of life. Hence, sin no longer has power over the believer. How marvelous is this gift!

The gospel tells us of the ultimate accomplishment and victory of the Risen Christ through His resurrection, "*He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said*". Alleluia. After the forty days of Lent, what is our experience? How do we encounter the Risen Christ? Are our lives transformed in some way or not? If the Risen Jesus is not part of our real daily life, what else are we looking for? How do we consider this newness of life which our Risen Lord offers us? May the light, life, glory, and grace of the Risen Christ illuminate our life. HAPPY AND BLESSED EASTER TO YOU ALL. Hallelujah, Hallelujah, Hallelujah.

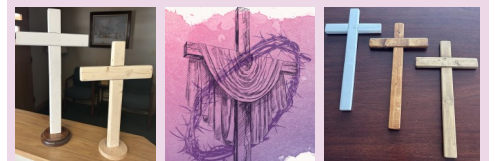
