OUR FAITH COMMUNITY

From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We are on the sixth Sunday of Easter. In the first reading we hear Phillip goes to Samaria, preaching to the people. The Samaritans were not considered Gentiles; they were seen as a step removed from Judaism. Hence preaching to them is considered a Gentile mission, where people experienced great joy by receiving baptism and the gift of the Holy Spirit by the laying of hands by Peter and John. Do we perceive and experience that great joy through the reception of the Sacraments and live in that joy of the Holy Spirit?

The second reading exhorts the community to sanctify Christ as Lord in our hearts. Then it explains to unbelievers the reason for our hope with gentleness and reverence. This could bring others to faith as their attention is caught and they are perhaps

intrigued by the unexpected. Their questions might be more aggressive in nature than polite curiosity, but as believers we are called to respond with peace and awe.

The Gospel describes the results that flow from loving Christ. The first consequence is that loving disciples will keep His commandments. The second result is Jesus praying for the another Advocate to be sent by the Father who is the Holy Spirit. Here Jesus explains the relational aspect of the divine presence which is profoundly related with the loving disciples. Hence the relationship between the Holy Trinity and the believers is that of mutual love. How do we grow every day in this loving relationship?

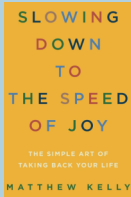

From the Parish Nurse

May is American Stroke Month. Strokes can happen to anyone, at any age. Recognizing the warning signs of a stroke can help you take action in the moments that matter. Learn the signs of a stroke and how to lower the risk for another one.



Susie is recuperating at an incredible pace from having a massive stroke, all because Sherry saw Susie stumble (that is the key) and then asked Susie three questions and this literally saved her life. Susie failed all three, and so she called 911. Even though she had a normal blood pressure and did not appear to be a stroke victim, as she could converse with the paramedics, they took her to the hospital.

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. The lack of awareness spells disaster and the stroke victim may suffer brain damage. Anyone can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

- * Ask the individual to SMILE.
- * Ask him/her to RAISE BOTH ARMS.
- * Ask the person to SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE.

If he/she has trouble with any of these tasks and **you spot a stroke warning sign,**

BE FAST:

- B** = Balance Loss (sudden)
- E** = Eye (Vision) Changes (sudden)
- F** = Face Drooping/Numbness
- A** = Arm Weakness or Numbness
- S** = Speech Difficulty/Slurred
- T** = Time to Call 911

Recognizing the stroke warning signs and calling 911 immediately may make the difference between a strong recovery or long-term disability, survival or death.
