# OUR FAITH COMMUNITY

## From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We are on the tenth Sunday in ordinary time, celebrating the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The first reading tells us about God providing Manna and Water for the people of Israel while they were in the desert for forty years. This was a part of the test where people who endured hunger would truly follow God's commandments. Their hunger served as a reminder that just as God's provision of food is life-giving, so is 'every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord'.

The second reading continues the theme of divine provision found in the first reading. It emphasizes the sacrificial nature of the Eucharist through the use of liturgical language, about the cup of blessing and the breaking of the bread. We hear these words at Mass whenever we participate. Thus, when we receive

Holy Communion, we are not simply taking part in the sharing of bread. It is a real 'participation in the body of Christ'.

The gospel is from the Bread of Life discourse in John's gospel. Our Lord himself teaches us that He is 'the living bread' from heaven. Like in the first reading, here Jesus clearly states that His body is the real food from heaven, given by God for our pilgrimage on earth. Whoever partakes of His body will live forever and that He gives His body for the life of the world. Do we long for this real Bread of Life and how do we prepare to receive it?

The primary image is the entrance of God's people into paradise, a kingdom of justice and peace. The public display of our faith is meant to welcome and show hospitality to all who witness it. Though our very old canopy is undergoing repair, we have devised a canopy style umbrella (*ombrellino*) to remind us of the tent that housed God's presence during the people's journey to the promised land. The canopy is also a visual guide to easily locate the Blessed Sacrament.

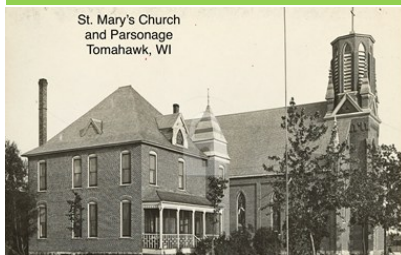

## From the Parish Nurse



Carbon monoxide (CO) is a gas that you cannot see or smell, but it can make you very sick or even cause death. The Lincoln County Health Department (LCHD), through a grant from the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, is offering **free CO detectors while supplies last**. Lincoln County residents with a financial need who do not have a detector or have one that is old or expired are eligible.

Carbon monoxide is produced anywhere fuels like gas, propane, charcoal, and wood are burned. This includes gas appliances, wood stoves and portable generators.

### CO Safety Tips:

- Install a working CO detector on every level of your home, including the basement.
- Replace detectors every five years (or according to manufacturer's instructions), replace batteries twice a year (change them when clocks change), and test the detector monthly.
- Exposure can occur during recreational activities, such as camping, boating or UTVing.

The symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning include headache, nausea, vomiting, weakness, dizziness, shortness of breath, blurred vision, sleepiness, confusion, and loss of consciousness. **If you notice these symptoms or your alarm sounds, respond immediately! Call 911 after moving to an area with fresh air.**

**Pick up a detector today from the Lincoln County Health Department** (607 N Sales Street, Suite 101, Merrill), **Monday-Friday 8:00AM-4:30PM**. If you are unable to pick up during these hours, need other pickup arrangements or have questions, please contact us at 715-536-0307 or email us at [www.lincolncountyhealthdepartment.com](http://www.lincolncountyhealthdepartment.com).

Perhaps you know of someone or a family that needs one. Make the connection, 'be your brother's keeper', and help them get one. Stay safe for a good summer outing.
