OUR FAITH COMMUNITY

From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

This Sunday is the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, known as the feast of Corpus Christi. In the first reading we hear Melchizedek bringing bread and wine to the king and priest of Salem to offer and invoke the blessing of God on Abram. With this presentation, Melchizedek prepares us for the offering that the Lord makes at the Last Supper and at every Eucharist. What is our faith relationship with this perpetual memorial of Eucharist where we commemorate the Passion, death and resurrection of the Lord?

The second reading reminds us of the celebration of the first Eucharist by the Lord at the Last Supper. These are the words of epiclesis used during the Mass remembering, recalling, reentering and re-participating in the Passion, death and resurrection of our Lord. Every holy Mass signifies the new

covenant which the Lord forges for us with God for the forgiveness of our sins and for our salvation.

The gospel presents to us about the miraculous multiplication of the loaves and the fish by the Lord and distributed to five thousand men. This incident recalls God's feeding of the chosen people during the wilderness wandering after the Exodus from slavery in Egypt. In doing so the Lord Jesus fulfills His mission to bring about a new Exodus, where He later feeds with His precious Body and Blood at the last supper. All those who participate with faith in the celebration of the Holy Eucharist and receive the precious body and blood of Jesus Christ will have a share in His new Exodus and new Covenant.

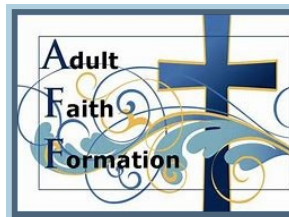

From the Parish Nurse

Summer is a wonderful time of year here in northern Wisconsin. With the warmer weather comes mosquitoes and the possibility of being exposed to West Nile virus. The illnesses caused by the West Nile Virus may be serious, such as encephalitis (inflammation of the brain) or meningitis (inflammation of the membranes and fluid surrounding the brain and spinal cord). Most people with the virus don't have symptoms or develop only a mild illness with less than 1% developing the serious illness.



Since 1999 the virus has spread. Wild and domestic birds are the primary carriers for West Nile virus. Once birds bring the virus to new areas, mosquitoes bite the birds, and then the mosquitoes can spread the virus to humans. It takes 5–15 days after you have been bitten by an infected mosquito before signs and symptoms of the illness appear. Common symptoms include fever, headache, backache, muscle aches, skin rash, and swollen lymph glands. If the infection does involve the brain the symptoms may include: severe headache, stupor, coma, stiff neck, disorientation, convulsions, muscle weakness, tremors, or paralysis.

See your doctor if you experience signs and symptoms that might suggest West Nile virus encephalitis. They can confirm the presence of the virus through a blood test and begin treatment of the symptoms as there is no specific antiviral treatment.

Taking steps to reduce exposure to mosquitoes is key to prevention. Limit unnecessary outdoor activity especially at dawn, dusk and early evening and being around standing water or stagnant ponds or swamps. Wear long sleeves and long pants. Apply insect repellents with 20-30% DEET. There are also many natural repellents to choose from to avoid adverse reactions and are recommended for children. Also available are aerosol emitters (tabletop or wearable) that work in those areas where you will be.

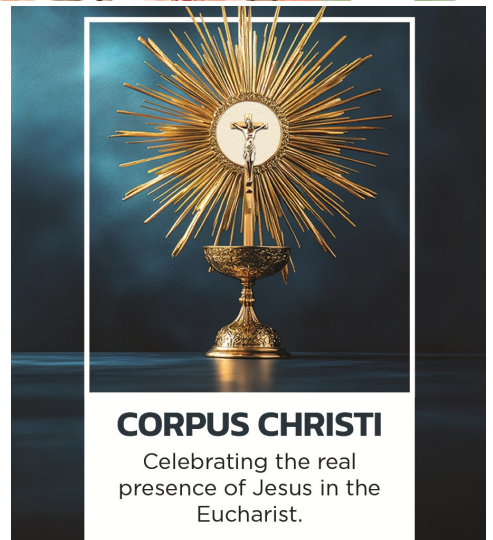
