## From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We are in the fourteenth ordinary Sunday of year A. In the first reading the prophet Zechariah calls the people to rejoice in the coming of salvation from God. He lists his reason for rejoicing for the coming of a future king who will be a just, victorious savior, meek, and riding on a donkey. This prophecy is about our Savior Jesus Christ, who Himself said that I am the meek and humble of heart. Do we learn from our divine Savior's heart?

The second reading focuses on the divine work of the Spirit, as well as the divine gift of son-ship and the divine purpose of suffering. The emphasis is that we are not in the flesh but in the spirit. It is the indwelling of the Spirit in us that makes us adopted children of God and heirs to the Kingdom. We all received the Spirit through baptism and therefore we are assured of the promise of bodily resurrection, which is possible

through the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Do we choose to live in the flesh or in the Spirit?

What was predicted and spoken about the future King our Savior in the first reading, is what we hear in the Gospel, who is meek and humble of heart. Jesus gives praise to the Father in heaven for inaugurating God's kingdom through the proclamation of the good news. The mysteries and truths of God's kingdom are revealed to the little ones who are more receptive and welcoming. Our Lord also assures us that His yoke is easy and His burden light. Do we try to look up to the Lord during unbearable tribulations and suffering, that He takes our pains and burdens and brings us peace, serenity and rest?

The Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary

In addition to Mass and praying the Rosary, this celebration will include a 9 day novena of prayers for Mary. We will start on August 31 and conclude on September 8. What is a novena? A traditional Catholic Novena is 9 consecutive days of prayers recited in union with others, or by yourself. ("Novem" is Latin for nine). Usually the prayers call on an intercession of a Saint, or to spiritually prepare for feast days. You may be familiar with the Divine Mercy Novena which our parish prays from Good Friday until Divine Mercy Sunday. This practice of praying for 9 days has Biblical Roots. The Apostles and the Virgin Mary spent 9 days of prayer together in the Upper Room, between Jesus' Ascension and the arrival of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. So when someone asks you "Why do Catholics do that?"--- Now you know! Please mark your calendar as we come together August 31 - September 8 to celebrate our patron saint - Mother Mary.

## From the Parish Nurse

Pray you all had a good 4<sup>th</sup> of July, celebrating our Nation's 250 years, and catching up as family and friends are home, reconnecting 'old times'.



Blueberry Banana Shake (a good start to your day)

- 2 cups non-fat vanilla frozen yogurt
- 1 cup soy beverage vanilla
- 1 cup blueberries
- 1 banana

Place all ingredients in a blender and blend at high speed until smooth. Powdered soy protein supplements may be added to the shake to increase the protein by 10-20 additional grams. Nutritional Analysis: Calories - 168; Cholesterol - 1; Protein - 6; Carbohydrate - 33; Sodium - 98; Fat - based on yogurt used.

Research shows that blueberries could be powerful little disease fighters. USDA Human Nutrition Center studies have found: 1) Blueberries rank #1 in antioxidant activity when compared to other fresh fruits and vegetables. Antioxidants help neutralize harmful by-products of metabolism called "free-radicals" that lead to cancer and other age-related diseases. 2) Blueberries may slow the age-related loss in mental capacity. And 3) Blueberries may reduce the build up of "bad" cholesterol that contributes to cardiovascular disease.

Blueberry picking is just around the corner and the bushes are loaded with this delicious fruit. So, prepare yourself and get out berry picking and then make and enjoy the shake! God bless! ~ Ann Jelinek RN, PN

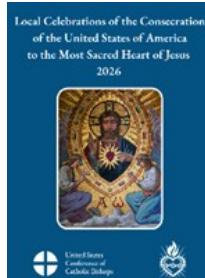
