OUR FAITH COMMUNITY

From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We are on the sixteenth ordinary Sunday of the year. The readings invite us to reflect on the theme of hospitality. In the first reading Abraham and Sarah serve the Lord by caring for the three men who come near their camp. The travelers get an opportunity to wash, drink and have a meal. They were honored as gods. Their response indicates the depth of that truth. They promise the barren Sarah will have a son within a year in her old age. The elderly couple's hospitality becomes a basis for God to extend grace and mercy to them. Do we treat our visitors as important and provide genuine and fitting hospitality?

In the second reading we hear St. Paul expanding and strengthening the Church, by means of accepting and even rejoicing in suffering. He recognizes his stewardship of a mystery previously hidden from Gentiles. He shares the hope of Christians and keeps no secret when it comes to sharing Christ. This sharing

of Christ freely to the point of suffering, matches with Abraham and Sarah's superabundant hospitality. Are we generous and willing to share Christ to others?

In the gospel, at the house of Martha and Mary another hospitality scene unfolds where two sisters take different approaches. Martha fusses over serving the guest and Mary eschews serving to be near the guest. Martha's service is not joyous as she finds it burdensome. By contrast, Abraham, Sarah and St. Paul give freely and joyously. Therefore, Jesus says Mary is in the right, even though she is not burdening herself with service. Hospitality to others should help us to look beyond our personal pain in order to see, receive and serve Jesus in others with joy and generosity.

From the Parish Nurse

Swimming Safety Tips:

Watch Kids Around Water

- Keep young children and weak swimmers within arms reach of an adult. Make sure more experienced swimmers are with a partner every time.
- When there are several adults present, choose one to be responsible for watching children in or near the water for a certain period of time, such as 15 minutes. After 15 minutes, select another adult to be the Water Watcher.
- Avoid distractions! Drowning is often silent and can occur in less than five minutes, so it is important to give your child all of your attention. Put away phones, books and magazines.

Teach Your Child to Swim

- Every child is different, so enroll children in swim lessons when they are ready. Consider their age, development and how often they are around water.

Make Sure Kids Learn these Five Water Survival Skills

- Step or jump into water over their head and return to the surface.
- Turn around in the water and orient to safety.
- Float or tread water.
- Combine breathing with forward movement in the water.
- Exit the water.

Tips for Pool Safety

- **Install fences around home pools.** A pool fence should surround all sides of the pool and be at least four feet tall with self-closing and self-latching gates.
- **Be aware of pool drains.** Teach your child not to swim near pool drains or suction outlets. Visit [Pool Safety](#) to learn more about available resources to keep kids safe around pool drains.
- **Empty kids' pools immediately after use.** Store them upside down and out of children's reach.
