From the Pastor

Examination of Conscience

Examination of conscience is an act of looking prayerfully into our hearts to ask how we have hurt our relationships with God and other people through our thoughts, words and actions, basing it on the Word of God and the teaching of the Church.

To have progressive growth in our spiritual life, we need to know ourselves: our sins, our weak points, our evil tendencies, as well as progress made already. This is the most important exercise of spiritual life. The soul must carefully investigate the cause of and the motive of the failures that we have committed. Knowing our dominant passions or faults, we need to struggle to destroy the evil at its root.

The more determined we are to correct our faults, the less faults that will be committed by us. Our desire and determination for sanctity should be to please God. This is possible only through the examination of conscience and correcting our faults. This examination of conscience should lead us to the Sacrament of Confession, instituted by Jesus who gave authority to his Apostles to forgive sins by saying, **“Whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained”** (John 20:23). Ultimately it is God who forgives our sins through the Apostles and their successors, ordained priests, and makes us His children.

From the Parish Nurse

Summer and warm weather means fun in the sun, but there are hazards that can occur when we play too hard. As I sit here enjoying the beauty that a beautiful, sunny, blue sky morning can bring, I can't help praying all are safely playing or working.

To truly enjoy the summer fun, take time to be safe, especially at all those summer celebrations and gatherings. We missed a lot last summer, but let us not sabotage this year by 'trying to make-up for lost time'. Wear your helmet when you are bicycling, horseback riding, skateboarding, or out on your ATV or motorcycle.

Take time to learn about the sport you are participating in and, especially, observe all safety precautions. Wear proper clothing, use sunscreen and bug spray and do some pre-fun warmup exercises to prevent those painful stretched and strained muscles. Don't over do it! You can always save some fun for the next time out.

Hot and humid temperatures are truly a challenge, especially when we gather as a church community. Orthostatic or postural syncope happens at church, graduations, weddings, or at events when standing a long time. It is more common if one keeps the knees "locked", this condition pools the blood in the leg veins. Reasons include heart problems, seizures, pressure on the neck from a too-tight tie, dehydration caused by heat, and too much alcohol or low blood sugar caused by not eating, anemia, or Vasovagal syncope caused by a sudden drop in blood pressure, which causes a drop in blood flow to the brain.

St. Mary's Church is prepared for these emergencies. Our ushers do an excellent job staying alert to these occurrences and acting to assist the person get help as needed. There is available, in the 'First Aid closet' (marked with a red, first aid cross): water, juice, sugar, and squeeze frosting for diabetic emergencies, and Kleenex, throat lozenges, and a first aid tackle box with supplies for other emergencies (nosebleed, vomiting, etc.). Also available is a hazardous waste cleanup pack, paper towels and gloves. An AED (automatic electronic defibrillator) and a wheel chair are kept in the gathering room in the back of church. If calling for an ambulance, please remember to give our address: 320 E. Washington Avenue, Tomahawk, but be sure that not 'everyone' is doing the calling.

If you have any questions please call, as being well informed will make any situation less stressful for all those present. Also, remember it is easier to take a sweater off when overheated, so dress accordingly and stay hydrated.
