From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We are in the seventeenth ordinary Sunday of year A. In the first reading we hear about the divine dream encounter of King Solomon. The conversation reflects Solomon's piety and God's fidelity. After recognition of his place in God's plan, Solomon makes his request for 'an understanding heart'. God is pleased with the request and grants it. It is for us to reflect, whether we request God for ourselves or for the good of others.

The second reading reminds us that God's care for His people is not distant, but a reality revealed through His Son. God's purpose of sending His Son into this world is to bring His people back into proper relationship with Him. God accomplished this reconciliation through His Son, to all those who responded

positively to God's invitation manifested by their faith in Christ Jesus. How do we respond freely to this Divine invitation?

In the gospel we hear the parables narrated by our Lord about the kingdom of heaven. Just as the apostles left everything behind to follow Christ, those who find treasure in Christ are called to follow Him to respond to the good news of the kingdom. The parables convey a sense of urgency to respond and they emphasize the value and joy of the kingdom of heaven. What is our approach and response to God's Kingdom?

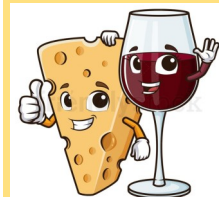


Youth & Religious Ed News

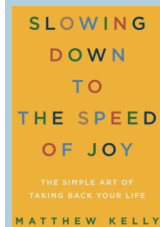

Avoid Bedtime Procrastination

A study of more than 2,400 people in the Netherlands found that 53% went to bed later than they wanted at least twice a week. Those who admitted to regularly delaying their bedtime were also more likely to report being poorly rested and scored lower in self-control tests.

Here are some solutions:

- Set a go-to-bed time when you will purposefully move into your bedroom. Try to stick with that time for a couple of weeks so that it becomes a habit.
- Set a routine leading up to closing your eyes: read, write, listen to soothing music, etc.
- Make sleep, not entertainment, your priority. If you don't have enough time to watch a favorite TV show before your go-to-bed time, don't start watching it. Record it or do without it. Your health – and the pleasure of sleep – is more important than knowing if they catch the criminal (spoiler alert: they will)!
- Don't wait to feel sleepy. Stick to the go-to-bed time. Soon your body will adjust and get sleepy at the right time.
- Resist the urge to do one more task before putting on the PJs.
- Don't forget your prayers!

God created bodies that require sleep. In the same way that we regularly eat to nourish our bodies, we strive to shut down for the night for consistent rest and renewal to tackle the new day.

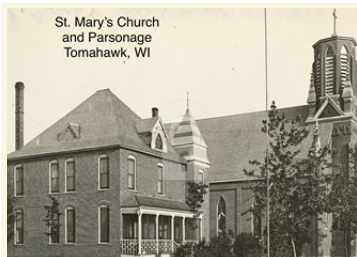
