#### **OUR FAITH COMMUNITY**

#### **From our Priest**

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We are in the nineteenth ordinary Sunday of year C. The first reading from Wisdom explores three key topics for both biblical and Greek wisdom traditions: foreknowledge, divine justice and the good. These three topics described in the reading lead us to a better understanding of who the people are, who God is, and the relationship between them. How do we try to grow in our relationship with God and His people, through the wisdom we gain by our spiritual life?

Second reading tells us about the significance of faith in one's life. The Old Testament community identified faith as a profoundly personal and spiritual reality which is constitutively tied to salvation history. OT figures like Abraham, Isaac and Jacob endured their lives by abiding in faith. They not only recognized

God's goodness but trusted it. By faith, they saw a future they would never occupy and remained confident in God's promises to them. How does our faith lead us to attain God's promises?

The Gospel continues the themes found in the first and second readings in the context of one's relationship with God and with others. The first part

of the Gospel tells us that God delights in giving the kingdom to us. Additionally, faithful trust in the Father's generosity calls for vigilant engagement in the Lord's work. The second part is a dialogue between Peter and Jesus, considering the negative repercussions of unfaithfulness. Our Lord contrasts faithful and unfaithful stewards. Which category we wish to belong between these two types of stewards? Do we consider our stewardship significant and be faithful fulfilling our responsibilities?

#### From the Parish Nurse

Picnic and barbecue season offers lots of opportunities for outdoor fun with family and friends. Warm weather events present opportunities for foodborne bacteria to thrive and multiply rapidly.

Food safety begins with proper hand cleaning - including in outdoor settings. If you don't have access to running water, use a water jug, some soap and paper towels. Or, consider using moist disposable towelettes for cleaning your hands. Take care to keep all utensils and platters clean when preparing food.

- Keep cold food cold in a cooler with ice or frozen gel packs. Meat, poultry and seafood may be packed while still frozen so that they stay cold longer.
- Organize cooler contents. Pack beverages in one cooler and perishable foods in another. That way, as picnickers open and reopen the beverage cooler the perishable foods won't be exposed to warm outdoor air temperatures.
- Limit the number of times the cooler is opened as much as you can. This helps to keep the contents cold longer.
- Be sure to keep raw meat, poultry and seafood securely wrapped, keeping their juices from contaminating prepared/cooked foods or foods that will be eaten raw.
- Clean your produce before packing them in the cooler including those with skins and rinds that are not eaten. Dry fruits and vegetables with a clean cloth towel or paper towel. Packaged fruits and vegetables that are labeled "ready-to-eat", "washed" or "triple washed" need not be washed.
- Keeping food at proper temperatures (indoor and out) is critical in preventing the growth of foodborne bacteria. The key is to never let your picnic food remain in the "Danger Zone" (between 40°F and 140°F) for more than 2 hours or 1 hour if outdoor temperatures are above 90°F. This is when bacteria in food can multiply rapidly and lead to foodborne illness.

Protecting yourself, and your family and friends from foodborne illness safe food handling is critical. (From: FDA and Lincoln County Health Department)

This consecration is an invitation to dedicate yourself to God and make yourself 100 percent available to carry out His will on this earth.
