OUR FAITH COMMUNITY

From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We are in the twentieth ordinary Sunday of year A. The first reading tells us that God's house shall be a house of prayer for all people. God's justice and salvific power embodies all people to those who observe what is right and do what is just. How do we consider this invitation of God to righteousness and justice? May our faith and devotion lead us always to God's house to pray, to encounter and to love the Almighty.

In the second reading we hear St. Paul's struggle to understand why his fellow Jews were not embracing his gospel of salvation. Consequently, Paul turned to the Gentiles, and the Jews' rejection has meant salvation for Gentiles. Thus Paul becomes an apostle of gentiles, though he is also the same for Jews. Finally, Paul concludes that in spite of their disobedience,

God saved all through His mercy. May we seek God's mercy always for our salvation.

In the Gospel we hear a non-Jewish lady approaching Jesus with a prayerful supplication to heal her daughter. She calls Jesus as Lord and Son of David, where Jesus remarks that her faith is great, which leads to the healing of her daughter. This passage also explains that Jesus's mission is expanded to the lost sheep of Israel and also to the Gentiles. How do we in such a context work out a difficult situation? May our faith lead us to Jesus who is there to help us always.

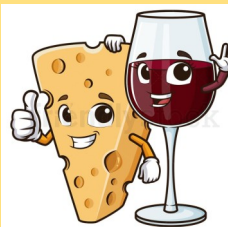

At this time of year, many of us are harvesting fresh fruits and vegetables from our gardens. According to DPI regulations, we are allowed to accept donations of fresh (not canned or frozen) produce. As you begin to harvest your crops, if you are fortunate enough to have extra fresh produce that you would like to donate to the hot lunch program it can be dropped off at school during regular office hours. From the Parish Nurse

"The sun shall not harm you by day, nor the moon by night" (Ps 121:6). The Hebrews were respectful of the sun's rays. This August - Summer Sun Safety Month reminds us to be respectful as well. Safe-sun guidelines include:

- 1) Avoid the sun as much as you are able, especially between 10AM and 4PM. The sun during these hours can do the most damage to your skin.
- 2) Put on sunscreen with a sun protection factor (SPF) of 15 or more. Use it even on cloudy days as the sun really is still out.
- 3) Slip, Slap, Slop - Slip on a long-sleeved shirt, slap on a wide-brimmed hat, sunglasses and pants, especially if you're on a medication that heightens a reaction to the sun (check with your pharmacist or healthcare provider), and slop on the SPF, rubbing it into the skin well everywhere the sun's rays can touch.
- 4) Don't try to get a tan!
- 5) Monthly, stand in front of a full-length mirror holding another small mirror and check every inch of your skin including the bottoms of your feet. You may need to enlist a family member to help you or see a dermatologist. Use the ABCDE rule when checking a mole: **A**symmetry, it should look round. **B**order, is it irregular? **C**hanged in color, is it darker than usual or blue, green, red, pink, purple, or gray? **D**iameter, has it changed or is it larger? **E**levation is it above the skin with a rough surface.

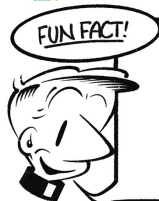
