OUR FAITH COMMUNITY

From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We are in the twenty third ordinary Sunday of year A. The first reading is from the first oracle of prophet Ezekiel, which consists of a doom prophecy and evokes the image of the watchman. The substance of the oracle is that God judges on the basis of the people's present disposition, without regard for their past good or evil. Hence the prophet consoles by declaring that people who repent need not worry about their past deeds, hence to turn from their evil ways and return to the Lord.

In the second reading we hear Paul's attention on moral issues about Jewish law and Christian interactions with civil authorities. In response to both issues, Paul recommends love. His reflection calls for an extremely sophisticated and mature level of love. He aligns love with sincerity and goodness and

contrasts it with evil. God's saving love is so great and immense that we can never repay. The one thing that those in Christ owe to everyone is to love one another as Christ loves us.

In the Gospel St. Matthew addresses the enduring Christian struggle with communal tensions by drawing on his Jewish heritage. It is regarding the correction of a member who sins. It addresses the resolution of communal tension. It contains three parts, reconciliation, competence of the community and the presence of the Lord in their midst. The overall context for all three parts is juridical. How responsible are we in helping our brothers and sisters in our community in correcting themselves.

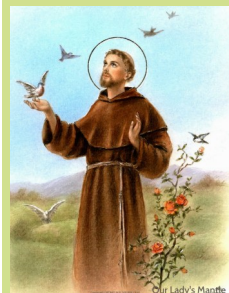

From the Parish Nurse

"988 Reasons: Your Reason is Reason Enough". You don't have to be in crisis to reach out to 988. 988 Day is September 8.



The 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline provides free and confidential support for people experiencing mental health and substance use concerns. People of all ages who need help for themselves or a loved one can call, text or chat 24/7. In Wisconsin they are answered by the 988 Wisconsin Lifeline, a service of Family Services of Northeast Wisconsin under a contract with the Wisconsin Department of Health Services. If the 988 Wisconsin Lifeline is unable to answer, the contact is routed automatically to a backup support center, which may be located in another state. 988 counselors understand that life's challenges can sometimes be difficult. They are trained to help you through stressful times and connect you with local resources if you need them. Many 988 counselors are bilingual. Third party interpreters for over 240 languages and dialects are available.

You'll be given some options to select the service that meets your needs. Your counselor will ask some questions to first make sure you are safe. You'll get one-on-one, judgment-free support. In addition to thoughts or feelings of suicide, 988 responds to anyone who needs support for mental health, suicide and/or substance use concerns. Other reasons include emotional distress, anxiety, depression, mental illness, loneliness, trauma, bullying, stress, relationship troubles, and just needing someone to talk with.

Numerous studies have shown that most people who contact 988 are significantly more likely to feel less depressed, less suicidal, less overwhelmed, and more hopeful after speaking to a 988 counselor. 988 counselors work to keep you safe, provide support in the least restrictive manner possible, and are able to work with you to de-escalate your situation. If there is an immediate physical safety threat, the 988 counselor will contact police or emergency services to help (<https://www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/crisis/988.htm#toolkit>).
