OUR FAITH COMMUNITY

From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We are in the twenty sixth ordinary Sunday of year A. The first reading teaches about individual responsibility. It tells us that the one who turns to wickedness shall die and the one who turns away from wickedness will live. The Prophet develops the argument that repentance is always possible, regardless of one's past life. An individual's fate will be assessed by whether he or she has turned to or from wickedness. Repentance leads to life.

In the second reading to the Philippians, St. Paul offers the superior example of Christ. Perhaps fearing that the weeds of selfishness, ambition and self-centeredness were compromising their unity. He begins to exhort them to be of the same mind and manner of thinking, and the same love and unity of heart. All should be done in imitation of Christ. To what extent do we

imitate our Lord and God, Jesus Christ?

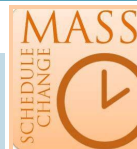
The gospel passage is part of a lengthy controversy between Jesus and the religious authorities. The parable of the two sons, draws on the popularity of John's ministry. Compared to the son who said yes to the father but failed to follow through, the actions of the chief priests and elders reveal them to be less open to the message and ministry of John and Jesus. Others, called sinners, are identified with the son who said no but eventually did His father's will. Hence, our future is determined not by the past but by the present. Repentance and change of heart to good, leads us to life with the Divine.

From the Parish Nurse

National Yoga Month (also called National Yoga Awareness Month) is an annual U.S. wellness observance held every September. It encourages people of all ages to explore yoga for flexibility, strength, stress reduction, pain relief, better breathing, weight management, improved circulation, cardiovascular conditioning, focus on the presence, inner peace, and overall wellbeing. It is a gentle, yet effective method of movement that can be adapted to your circumstance and abilities.

No one is too young, too large or small, thin or infirmed, to do yoga. It is **not** a religious exercise and at first might feel awkward, but it will not hurt you (if it does then back off and try the pose/stretch a different day). Feel good, be inspired, relax more, shape up, and increase your motivation. The foundation for yoga is built on three structures: Exercises (reaching and stretching) to put pressure on the body to increase efficiency; breathing based on concept that breath is the source of life in the body; and meditation quiets the mind to allow for silence, stress relief and healing. Over time regular practice of 10 min.-2 hrs. of all three parts of yoga is all it takes to feel the benefits and care for your gift (your body).

The St. Mary's Low Impact Strengthening & Balancing Exercise Class encourages people of all ages and stages to participate. It is a gentle program of exercises using chair or standing poses, encouraging everyone to only do the pose(s) they can do comfortably. We do lots of socialization as well and there is no cost or special equipment needed. We meet on Mondays in the CCC from 4-5PM. We hope to see you there!

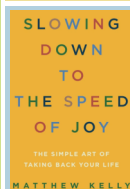

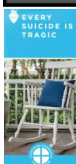
