OUR FAITH COMMUNITY

From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We are on the twenty eighth ordinary Sunday of year C. The first reading describes the miraculous healing of Naaman from his leprosy, by obediently following prophet Elisha's instruction. His response to his healing was threefold. First, returning to thank Elisha, second, recognizing the power of God, third, recognizing that the land he stood on was holy ground. How many times have we received God's healing touch in our lives? Did we realize and recognize the power of God in those moments and remain grateful?

The second reading tells us that the foundation of our hope as Christians is the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. This reveals to us the redemptive suffering which we endure, by which we will rise from the dead and live eternally rejoicing in God's

presence. However, our heavenly reward is not guaranteed simply by being baptized, we need to continue to persevere in our faith. Does our faith turn our attention to the needs of others rather than focusing on our own hardships?

The Gospel passage tells us about the healing of the ten lepers by Jesus. The Lord offers them a simple command which they obey and they are healed before they complete the entire command. It is their faith in the Lord's words which healed them. One of the healed ten lepers, who was a Samaritan, returned to Jesus to thank him, loudly glorifying God along the way. Are we not receiving God's abundant mercy, gifts and healing in our lives? Do we try to return to Him to express our gratitude? Do we consider going to Sunday Mass as an obligation or do we go with love and gratitude to God for His blessings?

From the Parish Nurse

"I'm afraid of falling, how can I improve my balance"? Balance is the key to preventing falls, and it naturally deteriorates as we get older. The good news is that it is never too late to gain it back. Several effective exercises can promote better balance. The simplest is standing on one leg, counting 5 seconds to begin, increasing the count as your balance improves. Repeat with the other leg. The practices of Yoga, tai chi, Pilates and weight training work on balance and improve strength. Strong muscles help to steady and support us.

Maintaining good balance is important for preventing falls and injuries. Join the Aging and Disability Resource Center and Merrill Bone and Joint on November 12 from 10-11:30AM at the Lincoln County Service Center. Physical Therapist, Cindy Koehler, will share various exercises to practice. Pre-register by calling the ADRC at 888-486-9545. Space is limited and the cost is FREE.

Also available is St. Mary's Strengthening and Balancing gathering each Monday from 4-5PM in the Corpus Christi Center. No cost, registration not necessary, and no special equipment.

Or get a prescription from your healthcare provider for physical therapy.

We all want to be at ease getting around. If you commit to working on your balance and strength, keeping your home safe, paying attention to how you are walking, and getting annual exams you may be able to put that 'fear of falling' behind you. You may even enjoy the Fall (the season) colors.

OCIA - Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (formerly known as RCIA - Rite changed to Order)

Have you ever thought about becoming Catholic? Were you baptized as a child but did not celebrate the Sacraments of Confirmation or Holy Eucharist? OCIA offers adults an opportunity to come together in a small group to learn more about the Catholic faith. Sessions focus on the teachings and practices of the Catholic Church and prepare individuals to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist and/or Confirmation.

OCIA classes, for anyone in our community, will be held at St. Mary's CCC starting the first week of Advent (day and time of weekly sessions to be determined by participants). After a break for Christmas, classes will continue weekly from January through reception of the sacraments at the Easter Vigil Mass on Saturday, April 4, 2026. Periodic meetings will continue until the end of the Easter Season on Pentecost, May 24, 2026.
