From our Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

We are on the thirty first week in ordinary time commemorating All Souls' Day. It is a very meaningful and heart touching celebration of the remembrance of our loved ones who have gone before us. The first reading from the book of wisdom considers the gift of immortality in relation to divine reward and punishment. Wisdom and other writings of Jewish Hellenism asserted that immortality is fundamental to human destiny. What does our faith tell us? How do we believe and prepare for this eternal destiny?

The second reading is taken from *Romans 5:5-11*, which tells us that hope does not disappoint us because of the love of God. He has expressed His love by pouring out His life as a libation for our salvation. Through His death and mercy, Christ has reconciled us with God and justified us by His precious blood which He paid as a

ransom for many.

How do we learn to remain connected with this Jesus, our Lord, who saves us? It is only by practicing our faith and remaining faithful to the reception of the sacraments.

The Gospel passage chosen is John 6:37-40, which gives us the assurance of the will of the Father in Heaven that none of us should be lost. The Risen Lord assures us that He will raise us up on the last day, all those who do the will of the Father in heaven. Isn't our final destiny clear? Do we still have doubts or questions about life after death? Don't we believe in the Resurrection of the dead? If yes, in what way do we wish to fulfill the will of the Father in Heaven? How do we prepare ourselves to be reunited with all the Angels, Saints, and our loved ones in Heaven?

From the Parish Nurse

The flu is a contagious illness caused by several types of influenza viruses. The virus infects the respiratory system—the nose, throat and lungs. There are four types of influenza viruses: A, B, C, and D (types A and B are responsible for seasonal flu epidemics). Type A is the most common in adults—and often the most harmful. Subtypes of type A have caused some of the deadliest flu pandemics in history.



A bout of flu may not only make you feel ill, but can end up putting you in the hospital with complications like pneumonia, even if you're a young, healthy adult. Your risk increases as you age, are pregnant, or if you have one or more of these conditions: chronic illnesses, a weakened immune system, and/or a body mass index (BMI) of 40 kg/m² or higher.

Flu shots help your body develop immunity to flu infection by triggering the immune system to get ready to fight off a future infection. Protection starts approximately two weeks after you get the shot. The flu shot is different each year, as they are designed to help protect against the influenza viruses that research indicates will be most common during the upcoming season. In 2024-25 season, all flu vaccines in the United States are trivalent vaccines, which means they protect against three different influenza viruses: an influenza A (H1N1) virus, an influenza A (H3N2) virus, and an influenza B/Victoria virus.

The flu season is just ahead, so now is the time to get that flu shot. Consult your medical clinic, pharmacist and county health department for any clinic session they are offering. Lincoln County is offering a no cost Flu Clinic for children ages 6 months and older on Wednesday, November 5 from 3-6PM. Appointments are needed, so please call 715-536-0307 to register.
