Our History

The Handel Society of Music was founded in 1966 by Karel ten Hoope, in preparation for Canada's Centennial year, and was directed by Maestro ten Hoope for 29 years until his retirement in 1995. He was succeeded by Maestro Johan Louwersheimer who continued to serve as our Artistic Director until, due to illness in his family, he stepped aside. Ms. Paula DeWitt stepped in to conduct for the 2019/20 season. Our choir, along with most others, struggled during the covid pandemic. In 2021 Maestro Louwersheimer returned, eventually retiring in 2023. Our new Artistic Director for the 2024/25 season is the highly accomplished musician and choir director, Ethan Liang.


The Handel Society takes great pride in its long history of nurturing the musical arts in the Fraser Valley. Local high school and college students are encouraged to sing with the choir, and performances often have included student orchestras and young musicians. Other performances have been joint productions with the Abbotsford Symphony Orchestra, many members of which also are involved with the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra, the CBC Symphony Orchestra, or the Vancouver Opera Orchestra.

The choir supports local musicians, both professional and amateur, to perform in their home community. Many very talented musicians have sung with the Handel Society Choir and continued on with successful professional careers. Some perform with the Vancouver Opera, the Pacific Opera, or other opera companies in Canada and the U.S. Others have performed in popular musicals. Some have gone abroad to continue their studies and sing. Still others are respected music educators.

Ethan is an accomplished conductor, pianist, fortepianist and harpsichordist. He is beginning his inaugural season as the Handel Society's Music Director.

His musical journey began in his pre-teens in his native Taiwan

focusing primarily on violin and piano. In high school his interest switched almost exclusively to piano. The range of the instrument, with its inherent ability to express orchestral pieces greatly appealed to him. He began playing everything from Bach to Chinese Pop.

Ethan's Canadian studies began with the renowned pianist Jane Hays while also attending Kwantlen University in Langley, BC. He also began playing jazz on weekends with a local group and became particularly fascinated with musical counterpoint. He pursued his undergraduate and graduate degrees in music at McGill University in Montreal During this time he began studying the fortepiano with Tom Begin and Harpsichord with Hank Knox. Ethan has a wide range of experience with chamber ensembles and choral groups as well as baroque orchestras on both piano and harpsichord.

His conducting experience includes choirs in Montreal and he has taught music and directed bands at several private schools including Bodewell High School and Cascade Christian School. In addition to his new role of Music Director with the Handel Society he is a music and classroom teacher in the Langley School District.

Adam Schmidt

Tenor

Adam Schmidt is a tenor based in Surrey, BC. His repertoire spans from the early renaissance to modern music still in development, and he is particularly known for his English and German Oratorio. Recent notable performances include St. John Passions with Victoria Baroque, and the Aura Chamber Choir and Messiahs

with Rosa Barocca and the Malaspina Choir. He began his academic career as a software engineer, but after performing in his first opera with Pacific Opera Victoria (Otello, 2015) he realized that if he was going to be paid to sing, the least he could do was get some professional training! He began studying at the Victoria Conservatory of Music and has been working in the arts ever since. Adam holds a BMus in Voice Performance from McGill, where he studied with John Mac Master and twin diplomas in Voice Performance and in Vocal Pedagogy from the Victoria Conservatory, where he studied with Nancy Argenta and Ingrid Attrot. Adam maintains a small studio of students and has given masterclasses in both the United States and Canada.



Willy Miles-Grenzberg Baritone

Willy Miles-Grenzberg has performed with the top opera companies, orchestras and choirs across Canada, as well as in churches, cafes, etc. as singer/song-writer/guitarist. He appears regularly with Vancouver Opera in both chorus and solo roles. He has performed as soloist in many of the great oratorios

with Vancouver Bach Choir, The Handel Society, The Vancouver Philharmonic Orchestra and The New Westminster Symphony. He has also performed with the Canadian Opera Co., Tapestry New Opera Works, The Elmer Iseler Singers, The Hamilton Bach-Elgar Choir, The Scarborough Symphony and the Amadeus Choir, among others.

In 1741, Georg Frideric Handel's career had hit a low point. After 30 years of success in writing Italian operas and oratorios for the British public, he saw the English losing interest in this style. His 1740-41 operatic season had failed miserably, and he was being hounded by creditors. Handel seriously considered returning to Germany. But that summer he received two letters which changed his mind.

One of the letters was from Oxford literary scholar Charles Jennens, who had provided the librettos to a number of Handel's previous works, inviting him to write an oratorio based on Scripture. Handel began work on the oratorio, writing the entire oratorio in about three weeks. It was titled "Messiah."

On April 13, 1742, with Handel at the harpsichord, the work opened in Dublin and moved its audience to tears.
