The Braided Medicine Institute is dedicated to advancing and documenting African traditional healing knowledge through integrative education and research.

Across Africa, healing traditions using medicinal plants, body therapies, movement, and community care have evolved over centuries. Today, these living knowledge systems are maintained by practitioners, elders, and communities.

Much of this knowledge is shared orally, making it vulnerable as generations change. The Braided Medicine Institute addresses this risk through structured education, ethical documentation, and collaborative research.

The institute creates pathways for studying, preserving, and sharing traditional knowledge, always respecting the communities that maintain these traditions.

Braided Medicine Institute – Vision Overview

Project Overview

The Braided Medicine Institute focuses on documenting African medicinal plant knowledge and healing practices within an integrative learning framework.

Healing traditions across Africa involving medicinal plants and community-based care are maintained by practitioners and elders, often passed on orally and at risk of being lost during generational change.

The institute supports responsible documentation, education, and practitioner collaboration, respecting the cultural and intellectual foundations of these traditions.

The Braided Medicine Institute is an educational and research initiative developed by AIM Tanzania Company Limited, a Tanzania-based organization focused on cultural tourism, wellness education, and community programming.

By focusing on practitioner collaboration, field observation, and integrative education, the institute contributes to African-centered medicine research and education in East Africa.

Educational Approach

The institute emphasizes studying healing systems through their underlying philosophies, diagnostic frameworks, and cultural contexts rather than simplified symptom-based approaches. This approach encourages careful observation, disciplined inquiry, and thoughtful clinical reasoning.

Students and collaborators document medicinal plant knowledge and healing practices through fieldwork, research, and exchange.

African Materia Medica Initiative

A central institute project is developing an African Materia Medica to document medicinal plants, their uses, preparation, environments, and safety.

Over time, this effort will contribute to a growing body of knowledge that supports education, research, and responsible engagement with African medicinal plant traditions.

Commitment to Ethical Collaboration

The institute promotes respectful engagement with traditional practitioners. Activities prioritize ethical collaboration, acknowledgment of knowledge sources, and recognition of practitioner contributions.

Through education, research, and cultural exchange, the institute seeks to support the responsible preservation and future development of African healing traditions.

Field documentation, practitioner collaboration, and education occur in partnership with local knowledge holders across Tanzania.
