## Welcome, Dr. Jonathan Spatola-Knoll!

We are happy to introduce to you, our new Accompanist & Organist, Jonathan Spatola-Knoll! Jonathan will begin with us on Sunday, January 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2021. The Music Committee, Deacons, Darrell and Pastor Mark are excited about Jonathan being a part of the Staff here at Olympia First Baptist. Below is a short Bio on Jonathan. We hope you will welcome him and make him feel at home and part of our faith community.:

*Dr. Jonathan Spatola-Knoll is an award-winning conductor, musicologist, violist, and collaborative pianist based in Olympia, WA. He has conducted collegiate and professional orchestras and choirs throughout the United States, and most recently served as music director of the Alma Symphony Orchestra and the Alma College Musical Theater Orchestra. The winner of the 2020 Cascade Conducting Fellowship, his accomplishments have also earned him a residency at the Salzburg Festival as a winner of the Vienna Philharmonic's Ansbacher Fellowship for Young Conductors.*

*An advocate of historically underrepresented composers, Jonathan is North America's leading expert on Swedish Romantic composer, organist, and feminist pioneer Elfrida Andrée (1841-1929). His articles and scholarly editions of her music have appeared in nationally and internationally respected publications like *Women & Music: A Journal of Gender and Culture*. He is currently editing her *First Symphony*. Despite being the earliest known symphony by a Swedish woman, it has remained unpublished since its 1869 premiere.*

*Jonathan holds advanced degrees in musicology and conducting from the University of California, Davis, where he acted as assistant conductor for the University Symphony Orchestra and University Chorus. As an instrumentalist, he has held positions as principal violist of the UC Davis Symphony and as a pianist and vocal coach at St. Martin's University and the Sacramento Opera. His academic appointments have included faculty positions at Alma College (Alma, MI) and Whitman College (Walla Walla, WA).*

I know that Christmas celebrations will look different in COVID -19 times, but I hope you will be able to celebrate safely and creatively with your loved ones. Luis and I are looking forward to celebrating our first Christmas married and having Christmas Zoom parties with our extended families and friends.

I am deeply grateful for your faithful giving to International Ministries that enables me to continue my ministry with Fundación Proyecto de Esperanza (House of Hope) in Bolivia. This year has been unpredictable and challenging, but God is still working in the midst of this crazy 2020. Never did I expect for ministry to turn virtual and for me to be in the States for 7 months.

Some of my highlights of this year are displayed in the pictures:

- 1) Many hands around the USA sewed masks for House of Hope to receive a \$10,000 grant! Thank you for all who help with this. We were recipients of the grant from Wheaton College in Illinois.
- 2) I have had an amazing language tutor and cultural guide, Jenny. She has helped me improve my Spanish. Even during quarantine, we still met weekly on WhatsApp video chat. Yay for technology!
- 3) I have really enjoyed the creative process of collaborating with my colleague Barb Bolick via Zoom calls as we work on the Talita Cumi Girls' Club curriculum. We are finished with the manuscript. Thank you for praying us through this part of the project! I can't wait to begin training Bolivian women in 2021 so they can start a girls' clubs in Santa Cruz.
- 4) Throughout this pandemic House of Hope was able to provide food, hand sanitizer, monetary gifts for bills and food for our House of Hope Cochabamba leaders and pastors. Also, we were able to provide resources for pastors in Santa Cruz during the strict 7-month quarantine. Many had no income for 7 months this year.
- 5) Spending time and building relationships with ministry partners. We are looking forward to how the Holy Spirit will lead us in 2021.
- 6) I got married! Luis and I were married on July 18<sup>th</sup> at COVID-19 friendly "Drive-in Wedding for our immediate families and close friends to attend safely.

I am very thankful for you and all of my partners who pray for me and give sacrificially towards my ministry. I pray that you have a safe, healthy, and a joy-filled Christmas and new year! We appreciate your prayers as Luis and I look forward to returning to Bolivia in 2021.
